

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

LOS ANGELES - The American Jewish Congress So. Calif. Div. has unanimously adopted a resolution protesting the imminent closing by the Austrian Government of Simon Wiesenthal's Documentation Center in Vienna. Wiesenthal tracked down Eichmann, Stangl and over 900 Nazi criminals.

NEW YORK - 25 American high school graduates and college students left July 29 for Israel to spend one year on Kibbutz Nachsholim, it was announced by Yehoshua Leor, National Coordinator of Sherut La'am in the U.S.

NEW YORK - Investment plans approved by the Investment Center of the Israel Government totalled over \$250 million in the first half of the year, more than a third higher than in the same period last year.

NEW YORK - The Industrial Safety Glass Company of Ashkelon, Israel, has received orders for its products from two American firms, Vinyl Design Company and Safety Optical Company of Philadelphia. These orders initiated the export of this product line of Israeli merchandise.

JERUSALEM (WNS) - The Greek Government has rejected an Israeli plea and declared that seven Arab terrorists will be released under terms of an agreement with six Arab commandos who hijacked and held for ransom a Greek airliner with 49 passengers and six crewmen.

NEW YORK - Harold O. Zimman, Lynn, Mass., communal leader, amateur sportsman and publisher, has been reappointed chairman of the Nanael Jeish Welfare Board (JWB) National Health and Physical Education Co, it was announced by Morton L. Mandel, JWB President.

KFAR CHABAD (LNS) - An emotion filled communal Bar Mitzvah for 22 boys orphaned during the Six-Day War or by military actions since, took place here in this Lubavitcher village near Tel Aviv, in the presence of more than four thousand guests, including the families and friends of the Bnei Mitzvah and numerous dignitaries, government and military officials.

JERUSALEM (WNS) - Reports reaching here told of riots breaking out among Jordanians sympathetic to Palestinian Guerrilla causes. The Jordan cabinet which over-ruled its Palestinian minority, reportedly anticipated demonstrations against its decision.

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) - Secretary General UThant has instituted a black out on all United Nations reactions to events in the Mideast and UN sources said the move was designed to avoid "rocking to boat during this period of sensitive negotiation."

NEW YORK (WNS) - The Gold College for Women in Jerusalem, which has certified more than 700 students as teachers since its establishment in 1958, is accepting applications from high-school graduates for six-month and one-year courses. Forms are available from the Torah Education and Culture Department, Jewish Agency, 515 Park Ave., New York, 10022.

TEL AVIV (WNS) - The Manufacturers Association of Israel reported that the nation's gross national product of \$4.750 million in 1969 amounted to 85 percent of Egypt's total of \$5.6 million and that Israel could overtake the Arab state within the next four years.

JERUSALEM (WNS) - Seif Eddin Zouabi, a 56-year-old Nazareth Arab presided over a meeting of the Knesset in his role as Deputy Speaker. He is the first Arab to run a Knesset meeting. Mr. Zouabi, a Labor Party member of Parliament since its inception and candidate for Deputy Minister of Agriculture, called on the Arab states to make peace with Israel.

NEW YORK (WNS) - The Hebrew Union College Cantorial School (Reform) reported that Barbara Ostfeld of North Haven, Conn., will attend the school starting next month and she could become the first female cantor in Jewish history upon her graduation.

JERUSALEM (WNS) - The Israeli government plans to establish major industrial centers in Judwa and in Samarie under an economic development plan drawn up by Minister-Without-Portfolio Shimon Peres.

JERUSALEM (WNS) - The Left-wing Mapam Party's full entry into the coalition government was completed when the Cabinet approved the appointment of two party members to head ministries. Minister-Without-Portfolio Victor Shemtov will be Minister of Health and Knesset Member Nathan Peled will be Minister of Immigrant Absorption.

NEW YORK (WNS) - The Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations said that the denial by the Nissan Motor Corp. of Japan that it was participating in the Arab boycott of Israel was "fabricated double-talk."
