## JEWES SEEK BINDING MIDEAST PEACE FIRST UN STEP IRKS ISRAEL

### RAVENHOLT FOR CONGRESS

### BILBRAY FOR ASSESSOR

JERUSALEM (WNS)-- Israeli leaders have expressed concern over the first step taken in the renewed search for a Mideast peace following a cease-fire between Israel and Egypt and the resumption of the mission of United Nations Mideast peace envoy, Gunnar V. Jarring.

The first step was Dr. Jarring's forwarding to UN Secretary General U Thant a letter noting his resumption of his peace effort. But the Jarring note contained

the proposals advanced by the United States without Israel's specific statement that the withdrawal envisioned by Washington would take place only as part of a final peace.

Israeli officials are fearful that failure to include this clarification in the officials UN document means that Israel can be depicted as agreeing to withdrawal before or without a final and binding peace treaty between Israel and the Arabs.

At the very least, Israeli officials saw a possible mouse-trap effort to force Israel to begin peace discussions from a position weaker than Premier Golda Meir had detailed in accepting the US peace initiative.

There was some talk that the failure to include Israeli clarification was a deliberate move by outside parties involved in the peace effort to undercut Israel even before serious discussions began and that this effort reflected sympathy toward the Arab and Soviet view on the Mideast crisis and the steps necessary to resolve it.

The Jarring letter also didn't contain Egypt's condition for accepting the U.S. plan, but Israeli spokesmen noted that this clarification was
