

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

LONDON (WNS)--The price of gasoline has gone up in a number of European countries as these nations have started to feel the effects of Syria's refusal to allow repairs on a major oil pipeline running through its territory that has been sabotaged over three months ago.

JERUSALEM (WNS)--Kupat Holim, the sick fund of Histadruth, has dropped supplying free medicines to members and has instituted "nominal charge" of seven to 14 percent per item.

JERUSALEM (WNS)--The Jewish National Fund plans to spend \$4,657,000 on land development, road construction and afforestation during the next three years, Fund Chairman Yaacov Tzur reported to the agency's executive.

BONN (WNS)--West Germany has begun to import Israeli Wine in bulk shipments and is using French tankers for transport.

NEW YORK (WNS)--Yeshiva University has purchased a five-acre tract in the Bayit Vegan quarters of Jerusalem for the establishment of a branch school.

JERUSALEM (WNS)--Tourism to Israel during the first six months of the year was up 11 percent to a new record for the period of 235,000 tourists.

NEW YORK - Harold O. Zimman, Lynn, Mass., communal leader, amateur sportsman and publisher, has been reappointed chairman of the National Jewish Welfare Board (JWB) National Health and Physical Education Committee, it was announced by Morton L. Mandel, JWB President.

less important. The Egyptian clarification called for Israeli withdrawal from all Arab territory plus the solution to the refugee problem.

Israeli officials noted that Premier Meir has declared that Israel would withdraw from occupied lands under a peace treaty and that the extent of the withdrawal --how much land is included in the word all --is one of the issues to be negotiated. Israel has also indicated it was willing to take back some Palestinians and would consider compensation for the other refugees.

Israel's concern over the Jarring letter was evident from Ambassador Yitzhak Rabin's hurried return from the U.S. to Jerusalem for consultations and the dispatching of Foreign Minister Abba Eban to UN to represent Israel in preliminary discussions.

The first stages will be at UN in deference to Egypt and Jordan which want the discussions to be as quiet and as far away from the spotlight as possible to avoid reactions from terrorist organizations and those Arab state which oppose any peace effort. In accepting the cease-fire, Israeli leaders emphasized that long

and difficult negotiation lie ahead before there was peace and security for Israel. Premier Meir said that Jerusalem viewed the cease fire "as a natural stage to be observed on the road to a contractual peace established on defensible, agreed borders between us and Egypt." But she added that in the absence of peace, Israel will continue to maintain its defense position.

Leaders of other nations have hailed the cease-fire with Moscow reporting the agreement as the result of Egyptian efforts. Russian and American roles were ignored to play down Moscow's deep involvement in the Mideast and to avoid having to recognize Washington's direct part in proposing the halt to fighting.

America's deep responsibility also included indicating to Egypt that the U.S. would prevail on Israel to return most of the occupied territories, diplomatic sources indicated. At the same time, Israel was told that withdrawal was the only way to achieve peace.

The result of America's efforts was Premier Meir's use of the word "withdrawal" for the first time in an address to the Knesset and the Gahal Party's walkout from the coalition government when the word was used.
