RAVENHOLT FOR CONGRESS

SOUTH LAKETAHOE -- Otto Ravenholt, Democratic candidate for Congress, reported incumbent Congressman Walter Baring has missed almost 30 per cent of roll call votes in the House and charged he is misrepresenting his voting record to Nevada voters.

Speaking to state employees at their annual picnic, Ravenholt said, "If your missed your job as often as the Congressman has, you wouldn't keep it very long."

"Mr. Baring claims to be Nevada's strong voice in Washington. This is just not true," Ravenholt said. Ravenholt noted his opponent was present for only 72 per cent of recorded roll calls in the first session of the Ninety-First Congress.

"Nevada's only representative has a worse voting attendance record than 90 per cent of the members of the

House. Many Nevadans who believe that he speaks for them have been misled," Ravenholt said.

Democratic Congressional candidate Otto Ravenholt praised action by Congress to end voting secrecy in the House of Representatives.

"This historic step is long overdue. It is unfortunate that the House has for so long refused to modernize its procedures," Ravenholt said.

He charged Nevada Rep. Walter Baring has utilized the secret voting procedures of the House to conceal his vote on amendments.

"Under the old system, Baring has repeatedly confused the public on his voting stand. This has been done both by the method of unrecorded teller votes and by the practice of pairing on many issues in which the Congressman does not reveal whether he is paired for or against a particular issue."

Although Ravenholt lauded the action to make amendment votes public, he added "it is a disservice to the people of Nevada that our congressman will not stand up and be counted unless he is compelled to by the rules."

Opus Magnin

Breathes there a Jew with antenna so dead he's never heard of Rabbi Edgar Magnin? For 55 years Dr. Magnin has been rabbi of Wilshire Boulevard Temple, of Los Angeles, one of the nation's largest shuls.

For 55 years Rabbi Magnin has mesmerized his congregation with his wisdom and his humor, which he uses right in the pulpit to vivify his message.

A favorite of scads of Hollywood stars, a writer for the daily papers and a familiar face to Western tv audiences, Dr. Magnin recently turned 80.

Will he retire? "I will not," he recently declared. He feels great, and he looks so young that not long ago a man said to him, "You look like Rabbi Magnin whom I saw 40 years ago. You must be his son."

Do you know of any other clergyman still on the job at 80? A man much younger than he, the famed Dr. Nelson Glueck, president of Magnin's alma mater, the Hebrew Union College Jewish Institute of Religion, just said he would retire in a year or two.

But not Dr. Magnin. He has two associate rabbis, and has more honors (including a raft of honorary degrees) than most Americans, but he's too involved with projects on behalf of Israel, Jewish youth, and his great congregation (known as Opus Magnin) to slow down.

One of the things engaging his attention is a new Los Angeles branch of the seminary from which he graduated in 1914. It will cost six million dollars. Dr. Magnin's parishioners are giving him a million for the school in honor of his 80th birthday.

Jolly and robust, looking like Ed Wynn and bursting with energy, Edgar Magnin regards his 80 years as the prelude to a brighter future of work for his nation and his faith. Congratulations!

NATURAL GAS PROPELS CAR 600 MILE

This car is a gas. It runs on gas, that is, just like the stuff the little woman cooks your dinner with, unless she or her kitchen is electrified.

The rocket-engined racer, "The Blue Flame", will attempt to break the present world land speed record of 600.601 m.p.h. in late August or September at the Bonneville Salt Flats in Utah. Fuel for the gas industry's racer is liquefied natural gas.

Liquefying natural gas to a temperature of 258 degrees below zero reduces its volume by a 600 to 1 ratio and the process permits storage of large quantities in compact spaces. Thus a tremendous amount of high-powered energy can be stored in a small space.

In the rocket engine of "The Blue Flame", natural gas will be oxidized by hydrogen peroxide in the burning process and the resultant thrust will presumably propel the vehicle across the salt flats at speeds unheard of for a land

car. Wind-tunnel tests indicated that its pencil-shaped design would permit the vehicle to travel at more than 900 m.p.h.

Gary Gabelich, a 29-year-old former test astronaut, will drive the racer in his attempt to become the fastest man on earth. Gabelich said his ten years experience with North American Rockwell convinced him that only a rocket-engine vehicle could break the record set five years ago by Craig Breedlove's jet-engine racer.

"The rocket, fueled with a cryogenic fuel such as liquefied natural gas, is just about the purest form of energy available," he said.

The 38-foot aluminum rocket car is designed to deliver 22,000 lbs. of maximum thrust. It will be modified for this year's run to provide 13,000 lbs. of thrust. "The Blue Flame" must travel at 606.607 m.p.h. or more to break Breedlove's 1965 record.

CANNON ANNOUNCES SCHOOL PROGRAM

The Clark County School District will participate in a \$298,744 program designed to test new methods of improving reading and mathematics skills, Nevada Sen. Howard W. Cannon announced.

Sponsored by the Office of Economic Opportunity, the one year experiment is based on educational innovations currently being developed by private industry, the senator said. Clark County is one of 18 selected school districts in the United States which will

participate under contracts totaling \$5.6 million.

It will subcontract with the Westinghouse Learning Corp. for operation of the program employing different approaches in improving the reading and math skills of under-achieving students in grades one through three and seven through nine.

"Hopefully, the results will provide evidence that society already has at its disposal the means for upgrading the basic learning skills of students who have fallen behind the rest of their classmates," Cannon said.
