WALTER CARSON FOR COMMISSIONER

Walter E. Carson, Democrat, filed for Clark County Commission, representing Las Vegas.

He is a long-time resident, a retired Air Force Colonel, with more than 40 awards for valor. He retired in Dec. 1969.

He graduated from Las Vegas High School and majored in Political Science at Michigan State University.

A fighter test pilot, he lectured in Atomic Sciences, did liaison work with foreign governments, was a member of Pres. Johnson's Science Advisory Committee, commander of NATO fighter escort forces in Berlin crises, was a Chief of Staff in Vietnam, planned world's largest air day for Las Vegas Kiwanis, was Nevada's most decorated serviceman.

His business management background includes 15 years in the military operating budget expenditures up to three quarters of a million dollars a month, and after retirement as an investor in Las Vegas real estate and in various businesses.

Here is his story and the main planks in his campaign:

At the present time almost everyone is aware of the danger of pollution, the abuse of pills, pot and paraphernalia used by those hooked on narcotics. This township is located generally between Sahara Boulevard and Desert Inn Road, and from approximately Decatur and the Boulder

Highway. This township has ample funds, because it has a high density of strip business and other sources of money from taxes. The good people in the vicinity of Valley High School petitioned the Board of County Commissioners with 600 names for a park near the high school where it could serve a dual purpose, similar to Hadland Park in the city of Las Vegas. These good people were turned down flat by the commissioners in spite of the fact that all of the details were worked out and all they needed was an authorization to proceed officially. In turn, they were offered another location too far away from the school where the citizens wanted it, and the land itself would have cost too much money to put it in shape to be made into the kind of facility that the residents of the area wanted because of the rough topography. I have been told by the same authority that they then tried for a second location that was generally favorable to meet the needs of the community with a parcel that would be donated to them for a park and they were again turned down. If these things can happen in one of our richest townships, then what can happen to the rest

of Clark Count? We need more park and recreational facilities all over Clark County. The Lake Mead Recreational area and the high cool mountain areas need more attention. Better facilities at the lake would also attract more tourism. Any society that will not do these things for itself, will consume itself in its own quagmire. The water from Lake Mead will spur an unparalleled growth in the valley. A myriad tenfold growth along with a kaleidoscope of prob-

lems arising from growth and sewage should be met promptly. We already have too many pressing problems to cope with without letting any more accumulate. What goes up must come down, and what comes into an area must go out. Dry lake beds should be preserved for future agriculture areas. Some dry lake beds are already in use growing plant life for natural vitamins and minerals, etc.
