MISSILE SITES AFTER PEACE PACT

ISRAEL PROTESTS POW TREATMENT

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israel has begun a campaign to arouse world public opinion to protest the treatment of Israeli POW's in Arab hands and to effect an exchange of Israeli and Arab POW's.

Israel holds 117 Arabs from Egypt, Syria and Jordan as POW's and has offered to ex-

change them for 16 Israelis (including three civilians) who are held by the Arabs. The Israeli offer has been rejected by the Arab states who, Israeli officials say, are content to have their soldiers remain POW's since they know they will be treated according to the terms of the Geneva Convention.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- "Before" and "after" photographs of Egyptian missile sites within 10 to 15 miles of the Suez Canal were shown to the press by a senior Israeli Army officer as "proof" that Egypt had violated the standstill cease-fire. Col. Yosef Caleff said the first set of pictures showed four SAM-2 missile sites in the early stages of construction on August 7, eight and one-half hours before the cease-fire began. The second set of pictures showed the same sites on Aug. 13 and Aug. 16 with

construction completed. It was impossible, he said, to have completed construction before the cease-fire went into effect; but he admitted there was nothing about the photographs to show just when they had been taken. The Colonel said the new missile sites, two of which are close enough to be effective against Israeli planes more than 12 miles from the Canal and the Israeli occupied side, had created a development that was "serious, but not catastrophic for us. They will make it dif-

O'CALLAGHAN FOR GOVERNOR

Back in 1961, Juvenile Judge David Zenoff -- now Supreme Court Justice Zenoff -- and Harry Levy, Chairman of the Clark County Juvenile Probation

Committee, made a decision that 10 years later -- in 1971 -- may produce a Governor for Nevada.

Judge Zenoff and Levy had been impressed with the outstanding work being done with juveniles in Henderson by a Basic High School teacher, Mike O'Callaghan. They reasoned that what O'Callaghan could do in Henderson, he could do for all of Clark County, and offered him the position of Chief Juvenile Probation Officer and Director of Court Services under Judge Zenoff.

O'Callaghan now admits that he was happy and content teaching school, and had not the offer been made by

THORNLEY FOR GOVERNOR

Democratic gubernatorial candidate Hank Thornley said one of the first things he would do if elected governor is fire Nevada State Prison warden Carl Hocker.

"I'd have to," Thornley told newsmen. "Public confidence in the job Hocker is doing had deteriorated. He seems to have this arbitrary attitude that it's Hocker's prison."

Thornley said he has the impression Hocker is hiding something because he asserted, the warden is too tight-lipped and won't let newsmen into the prison.

Thornley would also call for a full-scale investigation into con-

ditions at the prison, he said, especially homosexuality. "I'm not soft on criminals, but even if a man is a criminal he should not be subjected to homosexual attacks," which Thornley believes exist at the prison.

The 52-year old Thornley, who faces a showdown next week in the state primary against Mike O'Callaghan, also criticized the Nevada Public Servo the Nevada Public Service Commission for denying brothel owner Joe Conforte operation of the Reno city bus lines.

"They really blew it," he said. "They
