## Jews and Colleges

Running a college these days is so dangerous they're even letting Jews do it.

It is a well-known adage that under anti-Semitism a Jew has to be twice as good to get half as far.

That rule applied for a long time to col-lege teaching posts. There were many years when a Jew had trouble getting on the faculty of a college. And there's still a quota, I insist, on Jews in medical schools.

But now that college presidencies are so precarious that they are combat posts, access to the helm of a university is becoming increasingly possible for Jews.

Even before campus extremism raised the casualty tolls of college presidents to alarming heights, the University of Chicago elevated a Levi to the presidency. Dr. Levi is not only a Jew; he is the grandson of two great rabbis; the late Emil Hirsh and the Gerson Levi. Then, the University of Pennsylvania and Dartmouth followed suit and named Jews to the top post, as did other schools.

The latest in the roster is also the youngest person ever to head a college: Leon Botstein, 23, who will take over Franconia College and a mountain of debts in the slopes of New Hampshire.

Botstein, European born, is the son of parents both of whom teach at Einstein Medical School of Yeshiva University.

We wish all college presidents well. We also pray that even without crises. Jews will continue to fit into the higher academic scene.

And without calamities prodding them, may other groups open their doors and hearts to Jews: banks, insurance companies, yacht clubs, garden clubs, etc.

"Ike" Sover, 41, has assumed responsibilities as Director of the Western States for the Israel Government Tourist Office, Ministry of Tourism officials announced


