## JIM BILBRAY FOR ASSESSOR

Continuation of his fight for much-needed property tax reforms is one of the main goals of County Assessor James A. "Jim" Bilbray, candidate to succeed himself in the forthcoming election.

He cited as an example his sponsorship of a bill to be introduced in the forthcoming Legislature to grant relief to senior citizens living on a small, fixed income. He would, if reelected, continue to fight for the exemption of the tax on household furnishings.

He reiterated his firm opposition to any special additional property tax levy on mobile home owners, which had recently been suggested.

"I believe," he said, "that the equitable, competent and experienced administration of the County Assessor's office is most vitally and directly important to our city and county taxpayers. The professional organization we have put together, including our data processing procedures, has made our office a model copied by a number of other states, and the Philippines.

"I believe the experience I have gained in my 16 years in this office is a most important asset.

"Since first elected to office, the value of taxable property in our Clark County has increased from \$600 million to over THREE BILLION dollars, involving over 107,000 individual parcels of property. That's big business for Clark County, and it must be admini-

## RAVENHOLT FOR US CONGRESS

Prison reform with an emphasis on effective rehabilitation has been urged by Democratic Congressional candidate Otto Ravenholt.

The Democratic challenger to incumbent Congressman Walter Baring said "producing responsible lives must be the target of our correctional institutions so that these men and women are trained to return to society, not prison, after they are released."

Ravenholt made the remarks in a speech prepared for delivery to the Seventh Step Foundation in Las Vegas.

Ravenholt cited Supreme Court Chief Justice Warren Burger's

plea to state governors for state statutes to upgrade prisons. Ravenholt suggested Congress could take the lead to outline model statutes for states like Nevada where the reform of our prison is an "urgent necessity."

"Poor prison care is extremely costly to the public. If we apply sound methods of constructive rehabilitation in our institutions we can curb the incidence of crime and really reform the shattered life of the one-time criminal," Ravenholt said.
