## BROOKMAN FOR ASSEMBLY 4

Assemblyman Eileen Brookman, Democrat, Assembly District Four, is seeking her third term in the Nevada Assembly.

A member of the Legislature since 1967, she has been chairman of the Federal, Indian and Military Affairs Committee, and served on the Agriculture, Social Welfare, Building and Construction, Institutions, Library and Public Resources Committees.

During her legislative career, she has sponsored bills to expand citizenship privileges for Nevada Indians and to allow Nevada citizens unable to meet residence re-

quirements for local elections to vote for president and vice president.

She also has sponsored bills to expand Ne-

vada Industrial Commission benefits for injured workmen and their families, legislation to permit cities and counties to support local human relations commissions, and has sought to obtain higher state support for school districts.

Mrs. Brookman stated she advocates direct election of the president and vice president, and has been the sponsor of several pieces of legislation in the welfare field.

Active in various social and civic organizations during her 20 years residence in Las Vegas, Mrs. Brookman is a member of the Southern Nevada Human Relations Committee, a past president of B'nai B'rith Women and a member on the Pacific Southwest Regional Advisory Board, B'nai

What are Sammy's chances?

The bus trips, the cases of Coke, the baseball gloves, never once left a single kid disappointed. God knows how many future citizens of merit came out of Spring Mt. because Sammy provided a swimming pool. It wasn't easy, as we attest from personal observation. The law makers turned a deaf ear. It had to be done by private enterprise and Sammy was the motivating force behind the accomplishments which should have been the obligation of the state.

Bookmaker Sammy as a law maker, would be an innovation.

Here is a man who's profession would land him in the Bastille in any other state, looking to become a member of our legislature. That's what we love about Nevada. It is the last bastion of outspoken freedom for all. It's a man's character that counts, not his livelihood. If a man shows good judgment, that's the person we want to represent us.
