## CANNON FOR U.S. SENATOR

A few simple amendments to our Social Security legislation can help retired Americans beat the rising cost of living," Senator Howard Cannon said today.

"We need only to end discriminatory hiring practices based on age, permit men and women on retirement to work beyond existing age limits and to earn more than they are now permitted to earn to bring about a substantial increase in the earning and purchasing power of our senior citizens."

"There is no reason why this cannot be done," Cannon told political groups in Las Vegas. "There is no reason why in this age of affluence for the young, the poor and the old should grow only older and poorer every day - especially when they represent a reservoir of skills and talent badly needed and perfectly capable of contributing more to their own support and to the growth of our economy."

Twenty million

Americans are over 65, Cannon pointed out. Most of them are getting poorer and poorer every day, as prices, taxes and other living costs go up while their income levels remain fixed. While many of these older people are unable to work, thousands are not only able but willing and even anxious to continue productive and useful lives and to increase their limited income.

"The refusal of society to let them continue working beyond a fixed age, really becomes a kind of penalty for growing old," Cannon pointed out.

"It is a penalty," Cannon argued, "no older American should be forced to accept."

Calling the consumer "the anonymous and all too often silent partner in today's economy," Senator Howard Cannon argued for more legislation and stiffer regulatory agencies to protect Nevada shoppers from both physical and

financial risk.

"We consumers," Cannon pointed out, "have few ways of knowing if the food we buy is sanitary, adulterated, shortweighted, or overpriced. We haven't enough ways of judging the safety or real worth of any of the products bought and sold by all of us every day."

A strong supporter of consumer legislation from the beginning of his Senate Career, Cannon was long a member of the Commerce Consumer Sub-committee and showed himself still active in the fight for consumer protection on a campaign swing through Clark County yesterday.

"I have worked," Cannon said, "for tougher bills to control drug safety, color additives, hazardous substances labeling, auto and highway safety, truth in packaging of all products sold, truth in lending, child protection and the safety of fabrics, meats and poultry, household products, TV radiation, gas pipeline standards, and cigarette advertising."

"But we need even more regulatory laws and

agencies," Cannon said, pledging further active support for protective legislation in every area of our major concern today. "We must ensure the safety and reliability not only of food and drugs, but of clothing, housing, transportation, toys, tools and TV sets, in short of everything bought and sold in America today."

"Consumer Protection," Cannon concluded, is not a bonus to be granted the public at government whim. It is a right that must be continually guaranteed for the safety and security of all Americans."

## ALL CANDIDATES INVITED TO SUBMIT RESUMES

### BONNER FOR DISTRICT JUDGE

A letter from the heart of John Bonner, candidate for District Judge:

Dear Mr. Tell: Never in the history of Nevada has there been a greater need for drastic reform in the Judicial court system, from the Justice Court to the Supreme Court, than at the present time.

A resolution was introduced in the last session of the Legislature, which proposes to amend the judicial article of the Nevada Constitution by, among other things, establishing a system of County Courts. (See Assembly Concurrent Resolution No. 49). A Legislative Commission was created to make a study and to include the following factors:

1. Limits of jurisdiction;
2. Numbers of Judges in each court;
3. Manner of appeal to the District Court;
4. Electronic reporting, and
5. Any other matter necessary to complete a statute establishing county courts.

The said commission is directed to report the results of their study to the 1971 Legislature.

Such legislation is badly

needed in Clark County to relieve the congested court calendars.
