

HARRY REID, BORN IN NEVADA, EDUCATED IN WASHINGTON, WITH HIS FAMILY



REID BIRTHPLACE — Three decades ago, Harry Reid was born in this ancient wooden house in Searchlight, a tiny mining community in the southern tip of Nevada. "Some of my friends wonder how Mom and Dad managed to raise my three brothers and myself in this house," Reid says. "Let me tell you, we thought it was a great place."

100 per cent behind Harry in his quest for the Lieutenant Governorship. Here is what they have to say.

Reed Whipple, a lifelong leader of the Republican Party in Clark County, who served two decades as City Commissioner, in addition to being President of the Mormon Church in Southern Nevada, classifies himself as a Republican and a conservative. Says Whipple: "Harry Reid exemplifies the highest ideals of our nation's two political parties. He has a rare quality of representing the best interests of business, the elderly and young people, the hardhat worker and the poor. This is reflected by the almost universal support he has engendered in his campaign for this high state office." So you have it from men of stature. We add our own observation of Reid in recent years. We've seen Harry at senior citizen gatherings, youth rallies, clambakes, picnics and religious affairs. He is everywhere, spreading warmth, exuding sincerity, dispersing advice, radiating hope and extending a helping hand, all with a humility of being grateful for the opportunity to be on hand. That's a rare quality in a man. To know him is to trust him.

Harry, a native Nevadan, was born in Searchlight where his mom and dad had followed Harry's grandfather to make their living operating a mine. Harry and his three brothers learned to use a pick and shovel early in life. Since the entire population of Searchlight was less than 200, Harry's public schooling through the first eight grades was taught by a lone teacher. The Reid boys attended Basic High School in

established, then followed the initial burn center followed by intensive care and cardiac arrest units. Then Harry sought wider horizons.

Assemblyman Reid established himself as a fighter from the very outset. His name appeared on 15 law-strengthening bills that were enacted, and many more that did not pass. Laws were not enough, he advocated, "financing of adequate police protection is needed." That familiar cry of today, was Harry's years ago. He designed a measure to bring professionalism to public service and to cut down on political patronage. Hear that one before? He sponsored a bill to clear up problems of juvenile services by spelling out duties of a probation committee. He fought exhorbitant increases in rent. Almost single-handedly he defeated a Senate-passed bill giving legislators \$300 a month for expenses. Long before pollution became a recognized monster, Harry co-authored bills to control auto emissions and air defilement from

and fiscal responsibility along with constructive new ideas and the youth and courage to carry them out.'

Alvin Wartman, a Clark County Republican Central Committee Chairman, is a key member of "Republicans for Harry Reid" task force. Wartman, a city attorney, municipal and county court judge, declared: "I have known Harry and his opponent well. My personal knowledge leave me with no other choice in the matter."

U.S. Representative Walter Baring sponsored Harry's advent into the legal profession by paving the way for the brilliant student to attend George Washington University Law School in Washington D.C. To support his wife Landra, a childhood sweetheart, and their daughter, Lana, Harry served as a member of the Capitol Police Force.

Reid is the only man, to our knowledge, who received special dispention to take the Nevada Bar examination prior to his graduation from Law School. Almost immediately he was named prosecutor and city attorney for Henderson. It wasn't long before Harry became concerned with the lack of care being tendered patients in the hospitals. Harry became a candidate for Hospital Board, a county-wide election. industry. He was a one man giant killer of exhorbitant utility rates. Many of the measures did not pass, but the public and fellow legislators know where Harry stands.

His views on care and treatment of elderly citizens are legend. He is against cutbacks of state aid when Congress raises social security. He helped organize elder citizen groups, demanded low bus fare, better hospital care and upgrading of nursing homes.

On education Harry believes in well-paid, well-treated, dedicated teachers. "The biggest handup," according to Reid, is when the state ignores home rule and preempts the powers of local school boards, while failing to give them the tools needed to get the job done." He believes firmness is necessary to combat school violence, but he also realizes that crowded classrooms and understaffing contribute to the friction. "Our school systems should offer solutions and not become part of the problem," he asserts.

There you have Harry Reid and there you have some of the reasons why the Israelite endorses him without qualification.
