

### RAGGIO FOR U.S. SENATE

U.S. Senate Candidate William Raggio called for more honesty between the races as he presented his views on the racial problem in Nevada to members of the Voters League in West Las Vegas.

"Some blacks have been too cocksure that they can only advance the interests of their community by encouraging, openly or tacitly, the threat of turbulence," Raggio said. "Some whites have smugly assumed that the only way to preserve racial order is by knocking heads," he added.

Raggio pointed out that stubbornness among black and white adult leaders is evidenced in the behavior of children in Clark County schools and the racial clashes which have occurred this year.

Specifically, Raggio urged that equal job opportunities be provided in every field of endeavor for blacks with the talent skill and training to handle them.

Raggio told representatives of the black community that he is "opposed to the forced busing of black and white students away from their

neighborhood schools in order to artificially create an integration of the races."

He said he would support the transfer of black children into schools in the white community if black parents believe their children would get a better education there.

Raggio said blacks have good reason to doubt the assumption that the standard of education is equal in every school in the county.

He said he is committed to the objective of providing a college education to every qualified student. "This is of great importance to the black community," he said.

Raggio said he favors greater emphasis on vocational training and indicated he would support every effort to root employment discrimination out of our system.

He also urged members of the black community to take advantage of President's Nixon's "black capitalism" program which helps minority groups take advantage of business opportunities.

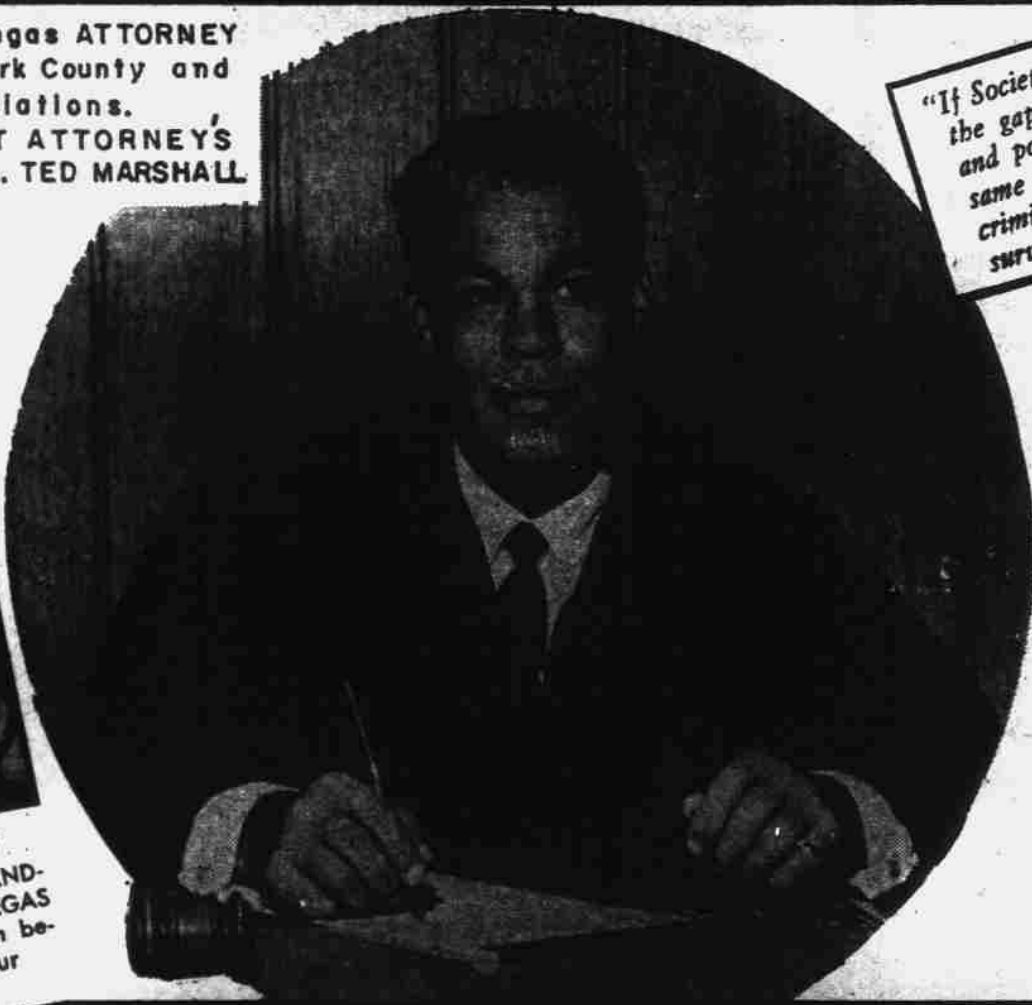
