

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

TEL AVIV (WNS) — Israeli leaders, confident there would be no resumption of shooting along Israel's frontiers, were attending the premiere of a movie "42:6" which describes the life of former Premier David Ben Gurion, when the 90-day cease-fire expired. All was quiet as midnight came and went.

JERUSALEM (WNS) — The cabinet will meet this weekend to discuss the meaning of the Afro-Asian resolution on the Middle East passed last week by a vote of 57-16 with 39 abstentions. The resolution was strenuously opposed by both Israel and the U.S., which introduced its own resolution in an attempt to draw off support from the Afro-Asian resolution. Twenty Latin American nations introduced a third resolution in a similar attempt.

NEW YORK (WNS) — The political myth of a "solid Jewish voting bloc" in New York City was shattered last week when Arthur J. Goldberg, the Democratic candidate for governor, and Richard L. Ottinger, the Democratic candidate for the Senate, were defeated by Republican Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller and Conservative Party candidate James L. Buckley. Jews comprise 30 percent of the city's population and were expected to vote overwhelmingly for the Jewish candidates.

NEW YORK (WNS) — The Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds has established an initial \$50,000 fund for national campus projects.

JERUSALEM (WNS) — The Israel Education Fund, founded in the U.S. five years ago, has raised \$35 million to build schools, colleges and pre-kindergarten facilities in Israel.

TEL AVIV (WNS) — Gen. Ezer Weizman, former Minister of Transport and Communication, and a Gahal Party leader, told the Surgical Association that Israel must either resume the Jarring talks or destroy the missiles in the Suez Canal zone. If Israel yields on the matter, Gen. Weizman said she would be pressed to withdraw from "areas we now consider Israel proper."

NEW YORK (WNS) — The number of Jewish conscientious objectors who have obtained IW alternative service from their draft boards and have been assigned to "national service under civilian direction" has increased from 28 in 1968, to over 100 in 1970, the Jewish Peace Fellowship reported.

NEW YORK (WNS) — Baron Edmond de Rothschild of France, chairman of the Israel Bond campaign in Europe since 1957, was honored by more than 300 Jewish leaders at a dinner sponsored by the International Board of Trustees of the Israel Board of Trustees of the Israel Bonds Organization.

WIESBADEN (WNS) — Six former SS officials went on trial last week, charged with murdering 65,000 Jews in Lublin, Poland during the war. The trial is expected to last eight months.

TEL AVIV (WNS) — Continued strikes by El Al maintenance workers and workers in the electrical industry are threatening Israel's economy. Meanwhile, a third strike of 1,000 teachers, has closed Israel's secondary schools.

TEL AVIV (WNS) — A Defense Ministry spokesman said Israel was capable of destroying all the Soviet missiles set up in the truce zone since the cease fire began.

JERUSALEM (WNS) — Police Minister Shlomo Hillel said Israel would be willing to surrender most of the occupied Arab territories in return for a "genuine" peace settlement. A real peace, he said, would see the withdrawal of all foreign armies from Arab territory, joint military commands aimed at Israel disbanded, and the end of the Arab boycott of Israel and all other anti-Israel acts.

HAIFA (WNS) — Twelve Marrano families, with 71 members, whose ancestors had lived in Italy for centuries, arrived in Israel last week.

TEHERAN (WNS) — An Arab move to prevent Israel from being represented on any committee of the International Air Transport Association (IATA) was decisively defeated.

NEW YORK (WNS) — The Rabbinical Council of America has called upon Attorney General John Mitchell to establish a special department to deal with bombings of churches, synagogues and public buildings.

ROME — In his All Saints Day address to the faithful in St. Peter's Square, Pope Paul VI urged prayers for an extension of the Middle East cease-fire and a "positive outcome" of the Mideast debate in the UN General Assembly.

TEL AVIV — Ten civilians and one Israeli soldier were injured in Gaza when a hand grenade was thrown at an Israeli army patrol. Eight of the casualties were Gaza residents. Two were Israeli Arabs.

ALBANY, N.Y. — Rabbi David Polish, vice president of the National Central Conference of American Rabbis, attacked UN Secretary General U Thant for his "determined and open advocacy of the Arab cause," "hostility to Israel," and personal "ineffectiveness." Rabbi Polish's attack was delivered at the annual convention of the National Federation of Temple Sisterhoods.

He specifically called for Israel to withdraw from East Jerusalem and the Golan Heights.

In denouncing the British position, Mrs. Meir declared "other people cannot decide for Israel, or for the Arabs for that matter, what secure, agreed, recognized borders are."

She said that Sir Alec was stating a "high moral principle" about the acquisition of territory but when a country is trying to destroy another country, "a different situation is created".

She questioned Jordan's acquisition of East Jerusalem and repeated her government's position that

Jerusalem would "never again" be divided.

Mrs. Meir also said, "When we think of the Golan Heights, we think not about territorial acquisition, but about the years when our settlements in the valley were subjected to daily murderous shellings from these same heights." Mrs. Meir added, "We will not resume shooting unless we are forced to in self-defense."

She concluded there was enough room for two states in the area of the original Palestine and said, "We don't care what they call theirs." But, she added, "Israel will never become Palestine."
