



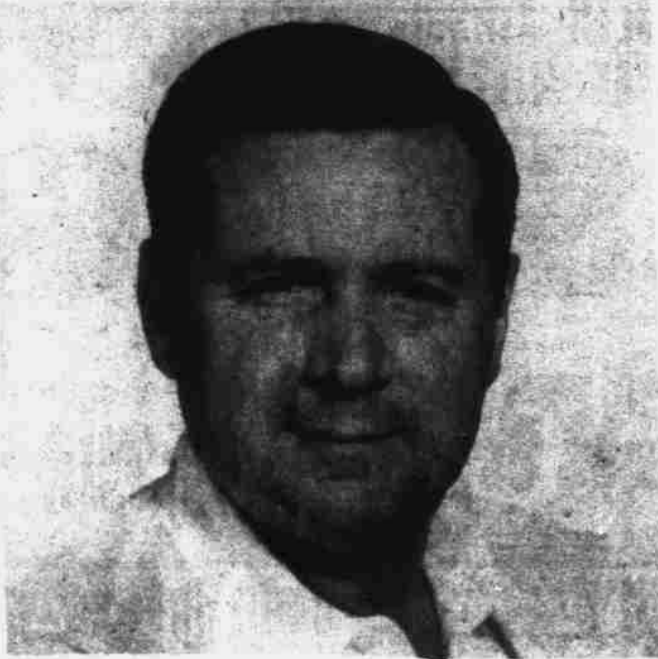
'HILLSWAY'

"JEWISH WEEK" DEBUTS IN NYC

NEW YORK:-- A new chapter in the history of American Jewish journalism has been opened with the appearance in New York of The Jewish Week, a full-size, six-column Jewish weekly newspaper, which, through a series of earlier mergers, is the fifth oldest American Jewish weekly in the United States.

The Jewish Week, the new name for the American Examiner with which it recently merged, is serving the Jewish community of Greater New York. It also publishes a Washington edition which was founded in 1965.

An independent journal edited and published by Philip Hochstein, for 40 years senior editorial executive of the chain of Newhouse Newspapers. The Jewish Week historically represents 113 years of continuous publication because it incorporates the Hebrew Messenger, published in New York from 1857 until its absorption by the American Hebrew in 1903. The American Hebrew, founded in 1879, absorbed the Hebrew Standard (founded in 1883) at the turn of the Century, and was itself later merged with the Jewish Tribune and the Jewish Examiner into the American Examiner. The latter had absorbed the Jewish Daily Bulletin in 1934.

Associated with Mr. Hochstein as executive editor of The Jewish Week is Victor M. Bienstock, veteran newspaperman, who was for 37 years general manager, editor, and foreign correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency. Serving as associate editor is Bernard Postal, former editor of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency and more recently public relations director of the National Jewish Welfare Board. Another associate editor is David Horowitz, the last editor of the American Examiner, who is a former president of the Foreign Press Association in New York. Mrs. Natalie Shear, managing editor of the Washington, D.C. edition of the Jewish Week, was formerly on the staff of the Newark Jewish News.

Hochstein said that be independent financially and editorially but will seek support on the basis of journalistic excellence. The paper, he emphasized, "wants no subsidy of incompetence failure or mediocrity because we are building a journalistic enterprise manned by people with a sense of obligation to the Jewish people. We aim to create a newspaper capable of standing on its own feet and financing its process of improvement out of its circulation and advertising revenue."
