 Paul and Western leaders urging them to intervene with Soviet authorities and protest the trials. Similar requests were sent by Histadrut to the International Federation of Free Trade Unions and by the Israeli Editors Association to the World Federation of Periodical Editors.
 From Paris came word that Prime Minister Jacques Chaban-Delmas and other prominent Frenchmen have promised to "intervene personally" with the Kremlin on behalf of the "Leningrad Eleven." Chaban-Delmas and former Foreign Minister Maurice Couve de Murville, are believed to have already written to Soviet leaders urging them to "consider the impact of the trial on the feelings of Western Europe."

In Copenhagen, 1,000 people attended a rally at the Jewish Community Center to protest the trial and express solidarity with Soviet Jews. They were addressed by Aksel Larsen, leader of the Socialist Peoples Party, Per Heckerup, a former foreign minister and a leader of the Social Democrats and Denmark's Chief Rabbi Bent Melchior.

From London, Dr. Nahum Goldmann, president of the World Jewish Congress, stated "the trial is aimed at intimidating Soviet Jewry and silencing their affirmation of their Jewish identity and desire to emigrate to Israel."

In New York, Rabbi Herschel Schacter, Chairman of the Ameri-

can Jewish Conference on Soviet Jewry and Dr. William A. Wexler, chairman of the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations, in a joint statement described the trial as a "travesty of justice."

The Jewish Labor Committee "appealed to men of good will everywhere, to the United Nations and to the American government to speak out" against the trial.

Hundreds of Jewish youth from New York area colleges and yeshiva high schools picketed the Soviet Mission to the UN and Rabbi Israel Miller, president of the American Zionist Federation said the defendants in the trial had been condemned before the trial opened.

The Executive Board of the Central Conference of American Rabbis urged the U.S. and Canada to open their doors to Soviet Jews wishing to emigrate "as had been done in the past with Hungarians, Cubans and others."

In Washington, 20 Jews continued their week-long vigil outside the Soviet Embassy while another 50 Jews picketed the Embassy area.

While Representative Joshua Ellberg, Democrat of Pennsylvania, urged the Nixon Administration to speak out against the trial, Mr. Ellberg charged "the Administration and the State Department have not lifted a pencil or raised the United States' voice above a whisper in protest to these trials."

DAYAN PRAISES PRES. NIXON

NEW YORK (WNS)-- Israel's Defense Minister Moshe Dayan, addressing more than 2,000 persons attending a United Jewish Appeal dinner, praised President Nixon for having "kept every word" to Israel since taking office.

Though he refused to discuss the contents of his conversation with the President and other high Administration officials he did say "I didn't ask for anything and nothing was promised me." But he added that he had requested to President Nixon that the U. S.

supply Israel with arms on an "on-going" rather than a "piece-meal" basis.

The General rejected the view that a return to Israel's pre-war 1967 borders would bring peace to the Middle East noting, that prior to the war Israel did not have the territories it was now being asked to relinquish. "Why, then, did we have war?" he asked.

Mr. Dayan stated that despite U.S. good will and diplomatic efforts, Israel is realistic enough to know that in the last

analysis, Israel's security and its future as the "homeland of the Jewish people" rests on two tenets: land and strength.

President Nixon wanted to assure the freedom of navigation when Nasser closed the waterway in 1956, he stated, adding "it remained closed for our soldiers' period."

He said that the dateless agreement of 1956 concerning the waterway was "decided" by limited soldier arms supplies, new foreign military equipment he had been assured by the U.S. that it would be provided if Israel refused the peace treaty.
