they can live their lives as Jews, without fear or favor. They are asking only that the pledge of Premier Kosygin of four years ago to allow Jews who wanted to leave the Soviet Union to rejoin their families in other lands finally be

fulfilled. They are asking only that they no longer be subject to religious, educational and cultural oppression in a climate of anti-Semitic propaganda.

Our thoughts too are again with our valiant brothers in Israel, who in the 21 years since the state was founded, have never known real peace. Having displayed the valor of the ancient Maccabees in preventing the destruction of their country through many bloody battles, the Israelis now, as ever, long for peace and offer the hand of friendship and amity to their neighbors. It is time for all the peoples of the Middle East finally to realize that true victory is not conquest but the ability of man to live in harmony with his fellow man and to build a better life for all.


If there is one message that our ancient holiday has for all mankind, it is that beliefs and emotions and traditions cannot be imposed by one people on another. We must all realize, on our tiny planet, that survival can stem only from each man and each people being permitted to find his own destiny. Oppression and conquest are outdated in a world of atomic weapons, of food shortages, of an increasingly poisoned atmosphere. Mankind must conquer these real ills, rather than wasting our precious resources of blood and treasure on the will o' the wisp of military adventure.

As our Christian friends and neighbors prepare to mark the anniversary of the birth of the Prince of Peace, and together we mark both Human Rights Day and Bill of Rights Day, we reiterate our deep and abiding commitment to peace, brotherhood and mutual understanding. We ask that the leaders of mankind be guided by the lessons of this season, that each man has a right to self-determination and to self-expression, and that progress can be made only in the absence of violence and oppression. We pray for peace, peace for us and for all men.

BUENOS AIRES (WNS)--Jewish leaders here were "up in arms" over the presence in Uruguay of two prominent Russian Jews, allegedly sent by Moscow to counteract reports of the repression of Soviet Jews. The Russian visitors deny that an "anti-Jewish campaign exists in the Soviet Union."

SAN FRANCISCO-- Church leaders across the nation have joined together, asking Christians to send Christmas cards to Ambassador Dobrynin at the Soviet Embassy in Washington D. C., marked "Let the Jews Go!" The project, initiated last year in San Francisco by Harold B. Light, Chairman of the Bay Area Council on Soviet Jewry, was announced recently at Grace Cathedral by the Rt. Rev. C. Kilmer Myers, Bishop of Episcopal Diocese of California, Rev. Russell Orr, Executive Minister of the American Baptist Church.
