MIRACLES OF OUR JEWISH LIFE

TEL AVIV-- In a life... moving address delivered to a 106-member United Jewish Appeal Operation Israel Mission, Israeli Minister of the Interior Yosef Burg described three 'miracles' of present-day Jewish

The 'miracles', he said, are "the American Jew who didn't forget, in his affluent circumstances, his traditional responsibility to other Jews in need; the Russian Jew who, in his poverty and suppression, did not forget his Judaism; and the courageous Jews who came here for the revival of the Jewish spirit, but who now fight for the survival of the Jewish people."

Minister Burg commended the American Jewish leaders for voluntarily participating in the Operation Israel mission and for their long-known concern for the human needs of new Jewish arrivals to Israel.

The American Jewish community leaders also met with Arieh Eliav, a prominent Israeli figure and member of the Knesset, during the Operation Israel farewell dinner.

JERUSALEM (WNS) --Israeli anger reached new heights as word reached here on Thursday that two of the Leningrad defendants--both of them Jews--had been sentenced to death by firing squad. The other nine defendants were sentenced to prison terms ranging from 4 to 15 years. They have seven days in which to appeal their sentences.

At the same time, news reached here of the arrest in Odessa of Raisa Anatolievna Palatnik, 34, who had several times applied for permission to emigrate to Israel.

The government's reaction to the sentences were voiced by Premier Golda Meir and other protests were voiced by Chief Rabbi Isaac Nissim, Trans-

PEACEKEEPING ARMED FORCES

WASHINGTON (WNS)--The U.S. has officially indicated for the first time that it was receptive to the idea of providing troops for a Middle East peacekeeping force under UN auspices if Israel and the Arabs could reach a "permanent contractual" peace settlement.

ARREST 12 IN SOVIET JEWS PROTEST

NEW YORK (WNS)--Twelve persons were arrested and several --including a high ranking police official --injured when a peaceful march up Madison Avenue by an estimated 10,000 persons protesting the plight of Soviet Jewry and the Leningrad trial suddenly erupted into a minor riot as some marchers attempted to break through police lines a block from the Soviet Mission to the UN. Eyewitnesses said the trouble erupted when Jewish Defense League members joined the marchers near the end of the march and incited them to break through the police barriers.

Among the marchers were, in addition to officials of the co-sponsoring American Jewish Conference on Soviet Jewry and the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations, Black civil rights leader Bayard Rustin, Father Donald Campion, editor of the Catholic weekly "America," Rep. Edward Koch, New York Democrat and Bronx Borough President Robert Abrams.

In a joint statement,

Rabbi Herschel Schacter, chairman of the Conference on Soviet Jewry, and Dr. William Wexler, chairman of the Presidents' Conference, declared "in the Soviet Union, justice is manipulated to serve the ends of the regime. The charges have no resemblance to fact." They said that those on trial had been "chosen by a cynical regime" as a warning to the Soviet's 3-1/2 million Jews of what could happen if they sought permission to leave the Soviet Union and emigrate to Israel.

Earlier, Rabbi Arthur J. Lelyveld of Cleveland, president of the American Jewish Congress, warned that "word coming out of the Soviet Union leads us to believe that forced 'confessions' may have been extracted from the Leningrad defendants."

In a related action, Council President Sanford D. Garelik introduced a resolution in the City Council deploring continuing anti-Semitism in the Soviet Union, instigated and encouraged by the government of that country and elsewhere to prepare similar declarations.

Back in the days when Mike O'Callaghan and "Moon" Mullins were tagging kids for curfew violation, we made a mental note about the two men; they would make good judges or mayors or governors or presidents.

Both have passed the half-way mark, with "Moon" ensconced as a Municipal Court judge and Mike to be sworn on Jan. 4 as the new Governor of Nevada.

Of course, they weren't the only ones we had in mind marked for bigger and better futures. Many others are on the way and some have dropped out of the picture. There were many reasons for our mental prognostications, but specifically, in the cases of Mike and "Moon" we saw law enforcement officers who were different. They didn't spend all their time catching offenders, seeking to convict and only to punish, punish, punish.

A large portion of their working hours, and apparently all of their off time, was devoted to prevention and cure. They didn't use the long arm of the law solely as the first step towards incarceration. More often they applied conversation before citation, and reason before raising the club. How did we know?

We were there and saw it happening. Our youngest son Mike, at 16, had opened the first teenage club in Las Vegas, the Twin Lakes Twist, and Mike and "Moon" were nightly visitors in making their rounds. We saw youngsters being talked to, being reasoned with, and we saw mutual respect being exchanged. We
