NEW YORK (WNS) -- Rabbi Herschel Schacter, chairman of the American Jewish Conference on Soviet Jewry, and Glenn Richter, national coordinator of the Student Struggle for Soviet Jewry, have denounced the Jewish Defense League for its tactics which disrupted a peaceful march protesting the Leningrad trial.

JERUSALEM (WNS)--The Hebrew University's Adult Education Centre opened the fourth academic year of its Arab-Jewish cultural project with a social attended by 600 people, including 350 Arabs from East Jerusalem and another 50 Arabs from Haifa,

DUSSELDORF (WNS)--Franz Stangl, former commandant of the Treblinka death camp, received a life sentence after being found guilty of participating in the death of 400,000 inmates, most of them Jews,

BROOKLYN (WNS)--The Jewish Cultural Institute, an independent student group, has opened an office on the campus of the Brooklyn College of the City University of New York.

NEW YORK (WNS)--The Committee on Control and Authorization of Campaigns of the UJA has announced an agreement between the Jewish National Fund and the United Jewish Appeal whereby JNF "will not hold public, fund-raising dinners and events in Jewish communities during the period from January I to June 15" so as to insure "the maximum success of the 1971 campaign on behalf of the UJA and its Emergency Fund."

MINNEAPOLIS (WNS)-- The Minneapolis Federation for Jewish Services raised \$1,058,000 through the sale of Israel Bonds at a special dinner held for that purpose.

TEL AVIV (WNS)--A Nablus military court has sentenced six members of an El Fatah cell to prison terms ranging from 30 months to six years after they were convicted of possessing arms and failing to act to prevent acts of sabotage.

LONDON (WNS)--Soviet Premier Alexei N. Kosygin demanded that Israel withdraw from all occupied Arab territories " as stipulated by Security Council Resolution 242 of November 22, 1967." He made the demand at a luncheon in Moscow honoring a visiting Egyptian delegation.

PARIS (WNS)--At French urging, the six nations of the Common Market will explore individual aspects of the Middle East problem in an attempt to formulate a common Middle East policy.
