BAY AREA JEWS STILL VIGOROUS

SAN FRANCISCO (WNS)--Orthodox Rabbi Robert E. Levinson of San Jose has denied that the consumption of kosher meat has declined in the San Francisco area as was reported by the San Francisco Jewish Bulletin last September.

In issuing his denial, Rabbi Levinson
agreed with Rabbi
Meyer Frankel, supervisor for the Board of
Kashruth in the Greater Bay area, who was
quoted in the original
story, that the number
of Kosher butchers in
San Francisco had declined from eight in
1935 to two in 1970, But

he said the reason for the decline was because "cattle slaughtered in San Francisco was of inferior quality" and in "this age of affluence" Jews observing dietary laws in the Bay Area were importing "kosher meat of a superior quality from Los Angeles, Denver, Omaha and other cities."

Rabbi Levinson also denied that the vigor of the Orthodox Jewish community had declined. He pointed out that there were 10 Orthodox synagogues in the Bay Area, seven in San Francisco, one in Oakland with a mikva (ritual bath), one in
