JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- The B'nai B'rith for the first time in decades, has cut its oper-ating budget to \$16.7 million.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Seif A-Din Zouabi, an Arab Knesset member from Nazareth, who is a deputy Speaker of the Knesset, has asked Premier Golda Meir to cancel his appointment to a sub-cabinet post. He would have been the first Arab to serve in such a position. Zouabi took his action after every cabinet member but one refused to accept him as an aide.

PHILADELPHIA (WNS) -- More than 1,000 trade union, business and civic leaders honored Hugh Carcella, vice president of the Pennsylvania AFL-CIO and chairman of the Steel Workers Legislative Committee of Pennsylvania at the 47th annual Histadrut Campaign fundraising dinner of labor and industry.

LONDON (WNS) -- The World Union of Jewish Students has proclaimed January 27 as a "Day of International Solidarity with Jews on Arab Countries."

PARIS (WNS) -- Aided by the French Foreign Ministry which supplied travel documents, 300 Egyptian Jews have arrived in Paris and been taken under the Wing of the welfare service of the Fond Sociale Juif Unifie, the major central Jewish communal organization in The FSJU reported some 2,000 North France. African Jews and 120 Jews from Eastern Europe arrived in France during the past 10 months.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- A Soviet official here, and the only Soviet Yiddish publication have both charged that Israel is trying to create a U.S.-Soviet rift. The Soviet Charge d'Affair Yuli Vorontsov made the charge to Senator Richard S. Schweiker, Democrat from Pennsylvania. Soviet Heimland, published under the jurisdiction of the Soviet government, charged in his current issue, that "not only the reactionary Israeli press, radio and television but also the government of Israel itself have joined in an anti-Soviet campaign,"

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israel has complained (the 30th time) to the United Nations Truce Supervision Organization that 2 Egyptian Mig 21s have flown over Israeli Suez Canal posi-

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The Jewish National Fund has dedicated the Major Adam Weiler Recreation Center and Children's Playground in the Jerusalem Forest to honor the late Major Weiler who died while leading his unit on a reconnaissance tour of the Suez Canal during the 1967 War.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- An Israeli soldier was injured east of Nevo Hama in the Southern Golan Heights when his vehicle hit a mine. An Arab terrorist on the Army "wanted list" was shot and captured in Jabaliya in the Gaza Strip when his actions roused suspicion of an army patrol. Police arrested 29 members of the Popular Front for the Liberation of Pales-This brings to 60 the number of guerrillas arrested in the past three weeks.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Six hundred Jewish youths from South America, South Africa and Australia have arrived in Israel to take part in the Jewish Agency's winter courses. They will stay from six to eight weeks.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Diplomatic observers here report Israel has reversed a long held position and agreed to discuss the question of borders at an early stage of the renewed peace talks if the Arab governments involved will publicly agree to seek a permanent peace pact.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- President Anwar Sadat of Egypt in a radio-television interview broadcast over the Columbia Broadcasting System has upheld the right of the Palestinians to the Arab lands occupied by Israel in the 1967 War, but declared he was opposed to the destruction of Israel.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Military authorities clamped an all-night curfew on the Gaza Strip as torrarise intensified grenade...activities against civilians.
