ISRAELI STAR ESTHER TOBI AT SAHARA

Esther Tobin has a way with a song and with her audience that has won her headline billing at most of the top supper clubs in the United States in the short space of three years.

In the parlance of the sports writers, she has "hit it out of the park" every time she's come to the plate. See for yourself at the Sahara where she is making her Las Vegas debut.

She's a Cinderella of Song who went to the ball, but never came home. Smart, original gowns Esther designed have replaced the drab khaki of an Israeli army uniform she wore for two and a half years. The story of that transition is almost fictional. It's the tale of a spirited, flashing eyed girl with faith in herself and her music; of a dream, born while Esther Tobin was in the colors of her country that hard work, talent, and luck have helped come true.

A few years ago Esther, the eldest of four children, completed her stint in the army in Israel, her birthplace, and enrolled in a dramatic school where she learned acting, singing and dancing. She believes that

a plot. A singer must try to achieve complete identification with her material; "if you believe it, your audience will buy it" comments Esther.

Esther was spotted by an American Talent Scout while starring in a play called "Servant and Two Masters". He signed her for a two month booking at a New York supper club. Esther came, saw, and conquered. The engagement was extended to a full year.

Stage presence, sensuality and smart stylish costuming plus a delivery that seems to hypnotize her listeners have won Esther plaudits from critics.

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
