EGYPT ACCUSED OF "DOUBLE DEALING"

RUSSIAN BABY, BORN IN ISRAEL

JERUSALEM (WNS)- Political sources here have accused Egypt of "double-dealing" on Middle East peace proposals. They claim that the Egyptian note to UN Mediator Gunnar V. Jarring and the Security Council, made public by the Egyptians, differed from and was "less moderate" than the still secret Egyptian reply to Israel's peace proposals that were delivered through Dr. Jarring.

However, the announced Egyptian statement does not call for a Security Council meeting (such a call had been expected in some political circles). It also does not request a formal peace agreement, something Israel is insisting upon.

The Egyptian note charged Israel with Procrastination to "escape carrying out

her obligation" and said that Egypt requires "Israeli withdrawal from Arab territories" captured in 1967 and a "just settlement for Palestinian refugees."

Jordan's reply to Israel's peace proposals were received in Jerusalem and closely paralleled the Egyptian response. It called for a return to the 1967 borders and a return of East Jerusalem to Jordan. The Jordanian reply said free access to the holy places would be guaranteed to persons of "all faiths."

Israeli sources noted that such guarantees were incorporated in the 1948 armistice agreement but Jewish access to Jewish holy places was banned by Jordan when it controlled "Old Jerusalem" from 1948 until June, 1967.

MIKE'S INAUGURAL BALL SAT. JAN. 30

The Las Vegas Inaugural Ball for Governor Mike O'Callaghan, to be held Saturday, January 30 at the Convention Center, will be open to the public at a nominal charge of \$5 per couple to defray expenses, Democratic State Chairman Phil Car-

lino disclosed.

Carlino, who is Presiding Chairman of the Inaugural Ball Executive Committee, said tickets can be obtained the evening of the affair at the Convention Center box office. The festivities are scheduled to begin at 9:00 p.m. At approximately 10:30, there will be a Grand March of elected state officials who are present.

Governor O'Callaghan was formally in-

augurated in front of the State Capitol in Carson City January 4, and for the first time in Nevada history, all living former Governors - Charles Russell - Grant Sawyer and Paul Laxalt - joined the new governor as he was sworn into office.

An Inaugural Ball for the Reno - Carson City area was held in the Reno Coliseum January 8, and drew approximately 8500. Carlino predicted that the Las Vegas event will exceed that, based on the inquiries that have been received.

A staff of more than 20 of the campaign Volunteers for O'Callaghan, under the direction of Chairman Margaret Lomprey, works daily on the many details that arise to insure an orderly Inaugural Ball.
