## JORDAN GOES ALONG WITH EGYPT

# CEASE FIRE EXTENDED TO MARCH 7

### EBAN PRAISES HUMANITARIANS

JERUSALEM (WNS) --Foreign Minister Abba Eban credited the efforts of international humanitarian groups with alleviating somewhat the plight of Jews remaining in Syria, Iraq and other Arab coun-

tries. But he warned that "the remnants of these communities are still held as hostages, subject to persecution, oppression and discrimination" and denied the universal human right to emigrate.

Eban addressed the Knesset on the second anniversary (according to the Hebrew calendar) of the mass hangings of Jews in Baghdad and Basra for allegedly spying for Israel. "The martyrs were put to death for a crime which they had not committed. Others were murdered or died of hideous torture in the prisons. Their sole crime lay in their being Jews," Eban said.

He noted that in Jan., 1970, about 100 public figures and religious leaders from 24 countries convened in Paris and set up the International Committee for the Jews in Arab countries, headed by Alain Poher, President of the French Senate. National committees in various countries were also established and the testimony they submitted on the situation of Jews in Arab lands aroused international public opinion.

LONDON (WNS)-- Egyptian President Anwar Sadat told his Egyptian National Assembly the current cease-fire on the Suez Canal would be extended another 30 days, and that further extension would depend on Israel's proposing a specific time-table for withdrawal from the occupied areas during that extension.

The current cease-fire had been scheduled to run out Feb. 5.

Cairo radio's earlier announcement of the planned extension drew a hasty disavowal by Government spokesman Munir Hafez of the broadcast. There was no explanation for the mixup: The new extension will continue the cease-fire until March 7.

Jordan had previously indicated it would go along with whatever decision Egypt made.

"One Man Plus The Truth

### Hanky Panky

Hell hath no fury like a publisher, or a man fired from a \$500,000-a-year job, scorned.

We hasten to assure the citizens of Nevada that it was Mike O'Callaghan who was elected governor, not Hank Greenspun, and that our new chief executive is a fair and honest man, who will not succumb to the pressures of the Las Vegas Sun owner. At the same time we call attention to the most recent desperation devise of Robert Maheu, who while shedding crocodile tears for the health and welfare of his former boss, Howard Hughes, apparently will resort to any maneuver in his quest for \$50,000,000, or any portion as a nuisance settlement.

Our indignation at the tactics of these two confederates in machination would be confined to personal feelings and never aired to our reading public, were it not for the fact that the fate of Nevada is at stake. It is evident Greenspun and Maheu will go to any lengths or sink to any depths to further their own personal gain. They have no regard for the public welfare or concern for the future of all of us who reside here and earn a livelihood, depending on the economy of our area. The greedy calousness of the unholy duo, if successful, could lead to disruption and even panic among the law-abiding, peaceful citizens.

It is our contention Greenspun and Maheu will not be successful, that they are clutching at straws. We maintain they are hoping diverting news, like the L.A. earthquake and the Welfare problem, will cloud the true circumstances, while they capitalize on unfounded allegations to gain the good will and support from the general public. Their main peg is the refusal of Hughes to appear personally.

An assumption, built on a false premise, like a structure, erected on a soft foundation, must of necessity, be followed but other perfidious commitments, until the aggregate, weighted by deceit and trickery, comes tumbling down. That is what could be in store for Maheu and Greenspun, and our only fear is that if and when they crumble, they do not drag down along with them the economy of Nevada and the welfare of all of us.

Robert Maheu opened plush offices for the purposes of conducting his "business consultant" venture. But his first order of business was calling a news conference and issuing a publicity statement about his concern with the failing health of his former boss, Howard Hughes, and how it was necessary for immediate depositions to support his (Maheu's) claim for \$50,000,000 against the Hughes Tool Co. The basis for Maheu's contention, on which he filed a motion in his case pending in District Court,
