WILL MAINTAIN BALANCE

NIXON SAYS U.S. WILL NOT IMPOSE SETTLEMENT

OPINIONS DIFFER ON BRUSSELS CONFERENCE

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Jewish leaders expressed differing opinions of the value and achievements of the World Conference on Soviet Jewry.

Zev Yaroslavsky of Los Angeles, chairman of the California Students for Soviet Jewry, termed the Conference a "cruel hoax" because it allegedly barred in advance delegates likely to make "any concrete proposal for action." Film producer-director Otto Preminger in Tel Aviv again voiced his disapproval that the Conference leadership had refused to permit Rabbi Meir Kahane, national chairman of the Jewish Defense League, to speak. In Jerusalem, the youth section of the National Religious Party adopted a resolution protesting Rabbi

Kahane's exclusion from the conference. And many delegates voiced disappointment at the "vagueness" of resolutions adopted by the Political Committee of the Conference.

On the other hand David Ben-Gurion, Israel's former Premier, declared that as a result of the Conference "more Jews will be able to leave Russia now than before."

At the UN, Mrs. Rita Hauser, U.S. delegate to the UN Human Rights Commission, charged that the Soviet Union practices widespread discrimination against Jews.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- President Nixon declared that the U.S. will not impose a settlement in the Middle East and would see that the balance of power is maintained. At a press conference devoted to foreign affairs, the President expressed the hope that the de facto truce would be continued and that Israel, Egypt and Jordan will observe it.

"As far as imposing a settlement," he continued, "we will be making suggestions, but we will have to depend on the parties to reach an agreement. We will see that the balance of power is maintained. We will join other powers, including the Soviet Union, in maintaining Israel's security that it would not get from territorial acquisition."

PERSUADE NOT PRESSURE

LONDON (WNS) -- Diplomatic sources here reported U.S. Secretary of State William P. Rogers had written to Egypt's Foreign Minister Mahmoud Riad assuring him that the U.S. was doing all it can to "persuade" Israel to

withdrawal to its pre-June 1967 borders.

The letter urged Egypt to be patient and use restraint. Observers here commented that the key word in the reported letter was "persuade" not "pressure."
