SHAZAR BELIEVES NIXON IS SYMPATHETIC TO ISRAEL

NEW YORK -- Leaders of the American Zionist Federation were told by President Zalman Shazar that he was convinced that President Nixon reacted with warm sympathy to

the problem of Israel's security, when he met with him earlier this week.

As he accepted the first and only honorary membership conferred by the American Zionist Federation, President Shazar said he told the American President he was speaking to him "not only as a fellow president, diplomat or statesman - but out of deep passion and commitment - as an old Jew and a Zionist who has devoted 70 years of his life to the cause of the Zionist Movement, 60 years of which were in the land of Israel."

Rabbi Israel Miller, president of the American Zionist Federation, in presenting President Shazar with the honorary membership, explained to the President that the American Zionist Federation is now "engaged in an effort to enroll one million American Jews in the Zionist Movement."

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israel released the full text of its latest note to Egypt containing the terms of a peace settlement it is prepared to offer Egypt.

The note, transmitted through UN Middle East mediator Dr. Gunnar V. Jarring on Feb. 26, stated flatly Israel's refusal to withdraw to the pre-Six-Day-War borders, but offered to terminate "all claims and states of war and acts of hostility or belligerency between Israel and Egypt" and to respect "the sovereignty, territorial integrity and political independence of the UAR."

It also expressed Israel's willingness to engage in "meaningful negotiations on all subjects relevant to a peace agreement" between the two countries.

At the same time Foreign Minister Abba Eban rejected Egyptian President Anwar Sadat's refusal to extend the Suez cease-fire. In refusing to renew of the cease-fire, Sadat said this did not mean "guns will start shooting." He said diplomatic peace initiatives will continue.

In rejecting Sadat's right to unilaterally abrogate the cease-fire, Eban stated that the cease-fire continues to exist by virtue of the Security Council Resolution of June, 1967 which established the

cease-fire that ended the Six-Day War.

The Israeli note, which was criticized by UN Secretary General U Thant, some Western diplomats and the UAR because of the refusal to withdraw to pre-war borders, has also been attacked because of Israel's stand on the Palestinian refugees and related problems.

The note said "Israel is prepared to negotiate with the governments directly involved on the payment of compensation for abandoned lands and property and participating in the planning of the rehabilitation of the refugees in the region."

It also pledged Israel not to permit acts of violence committed on its soil against the population, armed forces or property of the UAR, not to interfere in the domestic affairs of the UAR, and pledged not to participate in alliances against the UAR or permit the stationing

JACK ENTRATTER, 58
DIED MARCH 11, 1971

"What a stupid thing to do." With that shocking statement Danny Thomas commenced his eulogy of Jack Entratter at Temple Beth Shalom services last Friday morning.

"We dined on Monday before going to view the fight," said Thomas to show how sudden it all was, "and on Thursday morning, he was no longer with us."

Thomas reminded the hundreds assembled to pay our last respects, that since he was the first entertainer brought by "Big John" to the Sands, it was fitting he be the last to speak up before the body was shipped back to New York for burial.

With hardly a dry eye in the Synagogue, Thomas delivered a short but stirring panegyric.

"In life, 'Big John' had ailing feet," said Danny. "He never danced." Addressing the coffin, Thomas rendered a quote from his Lebanese father: "In heaven, dance pretty, 'Big John' because we all love you."

The Services conducted by Rabbi Aaron S. Gold and Cantor Joseph Kohn were surrounded with exquisite dignity, warmth and compassion for the passing of one of our leaders. The Israelite is deeply grateful, no doubt reflecting the sentiment of the entire Jewish community, for the heart-stirring tenderness of the spiritual reverence rendered so fittingly on short notice.

Those in attendance came from all walks of life, from chambermaids to business tycoons, representing every race, religion, creed and color. All had known and loved Entratter.

The Rabbi said Jack had lived two lives. One as a giant in the tinsel, neoned world of entertainment. The other as a family man, deeply religious, devoted to the memory of his late wife Dorothy, and his children and grandchildren. True, true, no question about it.

Percy More, the Negro executive director of Oakland's anti-poverty program and president of the California Community Action Program has charged that Governor Regan's plan was a "blatant act of anti-Semitism."
