SEC. ROGERS VIOLATED NIXON'S ORDER

Greening Festival

Passover is the festival of freedom, par excellence. Ancient Israel was emancipated from Egyptian bondage. Since the days when the Israelites were beaten by the taskmaster's whip and built the cities of Pithom and Raamses, the Jew has been obsessed with the goal of freedom for all men. The thousands of years of Jewish history, the struggle, the pain, the wanderings, the exile, mingled with the ever-constant dream of returning to Israel where, in freedom and stability, the Jew could breathe easier and express the creative gifts which were latent in his soul. Passover, then, mirrors not only the yearning of the Jew for his own freedom but it is a blueprint, revealing the potential blessings and opportunities for all people to make political and social freedom more than just a vision but an act of faith and a constant reality.

The Seder is not just a time of family reunion with all the traditional readings from the Haggadah and the culinary trimmings. It is an occasion for recommitment. We have tremendous responsibilities to help our people in Israel to be strong in their will to survive. We have to share symbolically the matzoh and wine with Soviet Jewry, no longer isolated and silent slaves. JERUSALEM (WNS) --Official sources here said that American Secretary of State William P. Rogers violated an order issued by President Nixon that Administration officials not comment on Israeli refusal to totally withdraw from occupied Arab territories, when the Secretary called for a complete Israeli withdrawal from the Sinai. Despite the Secretary's remarks, officials said, the President's order still stands.

The same sources state that the President is determined not to exert any pressure on Israel and to avoid any actions or statements that could be interpreted as pressure, even though he is convinced that Israeli security can be maintained with a

total withdrawal, and an American military guarantee of her security.

(In New York, the American Jewish Congress called on President Nixon to reject pressures aimed at forcing Israel to rely on international guarantees instead of defensible borders for her security. In an address to 800 students and faculty members at Brooklyn College, Yitzhak Rabin, Israeli Ambassador to the U. S. called for a "peace in the Middle East that does not call for the presence of American forces in the Middle East to neutralize Soviet forces, but rather complete the evacuation of all Soviet troops and facilities.")
