**ISRAEL PEOPLE WILL HAVE FINAL SAY ON ANY NEW BORDERS**

JERUSALEM (WNS) --Controversy and discussion continues in Israel over Premier Golda Meir's interview in the London Times, in which she disclosed Israel's willingness to return some Arab territories in return for a lasting peace settlement.

Even as her Labor Party's executive committee unanimously endorsed Mrs. Meir's position, stating that it "fully endorses the policies of the Israeli government seeking a just and lasting peace in defensible borders," opposition to Mrs. Meir's position was voiced within the party.

Seven leaders of a new "Circle for the Indivisibility of the Country" informed Mrs. Meir they were

planning to recruit 3,000 young men and women who have completed their military service to establish new settlements in the occupied Arab territories. This group parallels the goals of "The Land of Israel Movement," a non-party organization that is opposed to Israeli withdrawal from the occupied territories and that is headed by a prominent member of the Labor Party, Dr. Haim Yahil, chairman of the Israel Broadcasting Authority.

In an apparent move to quiet the controversy, Israel Galili, Minister Without-Portfolio and an influential member of the Cabinet, announced that the Israeli people would have the final say on any "map" of the country's recommended borders.

**JACKSON RAPS NIXON'S AID TO ISRAEL**

WASHINGTON (WNS) --Sen. Henry M. Jackson, Democrat of Washington, charged that Israel will not receive the \$500 million military aid Congress authorized for her last year under Pres. Nixon's new budget request. In attacking the President's budget request to extend military credit to Israel as "wholly inadequate, both as to amount and terms," Sen. Jackson pointed out that the President had requested \$582 million in military aid for 15 countries, without setting forth specific sums for each country, making it highly unlikely that Israel would receive the \$500 million previously authorized.

The Senator deplored the President's seeking aid to Israel under the Foreign Military Sales Act rather than using the authority granted him under Sec. 501 of the Defense military credit to Israel."

**L.V. COMBINED JEWISH APPEAL**

Mel Exber, prominent local business man and president of Temple Beth Shalom was named general chairman of the Las Vegas Combined Jewish Appeal by David Goldwater, president of the Combined Jewish Appeal.

This will mark the opening of the mobilizing of community support for the 1971 C.J.A.-Israel Emergency Fund.

In accepting the general chairmanship, Mr. Exber emphasized that "in 1971 the people of Israel are facing the greatest crisis they have ever known.

This year they will spend four times as much for defense as in 1967... approximately 90 % of their entire tax income will be spent for this purpose.

This means they will have no cash reserve left for vital health, education and social wel-

fare programs ... humanitarian programs which have been the traditional responsibility of world Jewry."

Mr. Exber noted that the financial emergency means that more than ever the people of Israel and Jews throughout the world must have help in order to survive.

Without it, their struggle for existence will have little meaning.

Mr. Exber said, "the year 1971 is crucial in Israel's fight for survival. Our community must meet this challenge."

Goldwater, addressing community leaders, to launch formerly the 1971 campaign, urged their banding together to pledge support for the urgent humanitarian needs of world-wide Jewry.
