LONDON (WNS) -- Amnesty International, a private, London-based organization that is interested in the rights of political prisoners all over the world, has identified by name 36 Jews being detained by Iraqi authorities and said they would probably be charged with attempting to leave the country illegally. This refuted the statement of April 12 by the Iraqi government that no Jews were being held. Reports earlier in the week that 40 Iraqi Jews had been arrested and that three of them faced summary execution had upset and aroused the world Jewish community.

(In Jerusalem, on Wednesday, Foreign Minister Abba Eban had rejected the Iraqi statement, telling the Knesset that according to reports reaching Is-

rael, dozens of Jews had been arrested in recent weeks and those Jews who had been arrested last December and had been released, now faced re-arrest and trial.)

The Iraqi Ambassador here confirmed that 20 Jews had been questioned for allegedly attempting to leave Iraq, but said that all had been released. However, the Iraqi News Agency reported that 16 Jews and five Moslems will go on trial for attempting to smuggle large sums of money out of the country.

Amnesty International said that it was "virtually impossible for Iraqi Jews to obtain passports. Only six Jews have been able to buy their way out; these have all been old, sick and wealthy--the last man to leave paid \$3,600

MEET BILL BRIARE

When Bill Briare and his lovely wife, Jo, were honeymooning at the Desert Inn, back in June of 1953, they were awe-struck by two items, first: a movie star of Johnny Weismuller's capacity was entertaining in person in the main show room, and second: they realized the potential of Las Vegas as a land of promise for a young family.

A short time thereafter, when the opportunity presented itself with a position here in insurance, it didn't take the Briares long

to make up their minds. In fact, the decision was reached in the time it takes to board a plane at McCarran.

Eighteen years and five children later (Linda, the eldest was born in San Francisco) Bill is candidate for Mayor. It wasn't easy, and there were no short cuts. It took loads of courage, powerful determination, a world of drive and farsightedness that had no brother to arrive at his present status. He certainly is no falsh in the pan.

No sooner was he settled in Las Vegas, Briare joined the Young Democrats. His reason, he states, was to be in politics just in case any of his sons needed the connection to get into military or naval school. It wasn't long before he was local president, then regional director and finally President of State Young Democrats.

He served one term in the State Assembly and eight years as County Commissioner until 1970. Although he was Chairman of the Commission, Briare decided not to run for sure
