## ISRAEL'S SUEZ PROPOSALS REJECTED

### ROBERT SHAPIRO BAR MITZVAH

Social Hall immediately after the conclusion of the services.

JERUSALEM (WNS) --Israel has submitted its proposals for the reopening of the Suez Canal to the U.S. Government for transmission to Cairo. Though the proposals have not yet been submitted to Egypt and the terms not officially revealed, the semi-official Egyptian newspaper Al Ahram reported that Egypt has rejected them.

Reportedly, Israel's plan calls for a withdrawal of some Israeli forces to a point 4.3

miles from the East Bank, would permit no Egyptian or Soviet troops to cross the Canal (but would permit armed civilian Egyptian guards under civilian control to protect Canal workers); requires an end to Egyptian belligerency toward Israel, and would permit the transit of Israeli vessels through the Canal. (In Washington, State Department spokesmen refused comment on reports that Russia, at the last meeting of the Big Four UN Ambassadors in New York, had bitterly attacked the U.S. for its role in seeking an interim agreement that would permit the reopening of the Canal.)

Meanwhile, official circles here said that Israel would welcome a visit by U.S. Secretary of State William P. Rogers who is scheduled to attend a meeting of the Central Treaty Organization powers in Ankara, Turkey, at the end of April.

a deputation of West Bank Arab leaders. West Bank leaders have been received by visiting diplomatic leaders in the past. Israel has no objections to such a meeting, but Jordan does.

### DIVERGENT VIEWS ON SUEZ

JERUSALEM (WNS)-- Sharply divergent views between the U.S. and Israel on methods to achieve an interim agreement that would permit the reopening of the Suez Canal may mar the visit here on May 7 or 8 of U.S. Secretary of State William P. Rogers, informed sources said.

These sources described as "unpleasant" last weeks meeting between Rogers and Deputy Premier Yigal Allon in Washington. Reportedly, Rogers told Allon, "I am getting the impression that you are doing all you can to frustrate an agreement with

Egypt." He was said to have told Allon that Egypt and the USSR were sincerely interested in preventing a renewal of fighting.

When Rogers arrives in Israel, he will be faced with another diplomatic problem whether or not to receive
