"One Man Plus The Truth Constitutes A Majority"

(EDITOR'S NOTE: Due to a breakdown of typesetting equipment, we regret the L.V. Israelite could not publish a Tell Tale column in last week's edition. The same column, with a few updated revisions, is presented here.)

After all the arguments, pro and con, have been aired whether it is proper to publish officially stamped secret U.S. documents, the controversy narrows down to two basic principles, and strange to report, neither one has been brought out in the court hearings to date.

The government, in its court battle to stop further publication, contends it will be harmful to national defense interests. The newspapers maintain, since the information in the documents is more than four years old, it has greater historic value and will not be detrimental to national security.

We believe the publication of stolen, secret, U.S. stamped secret documents is a legal, moral and ethical wrongdoing, and will pose the greatest threat to the free press since the beginning of journalism in America.

This may seem a strange view presented by a publisher who has staked his reputation and fortune on the strongest interpretation of free press granted by the U.S. Constitution. But even the strongest interpretation has its limitations. Thereby lies one of the principles involved in the unprecedented action.

Our son Jay, who presents the opposite view in a lengthy story in this week's Las Vegas Free Press, contends that the wording of the right to free press in the U.S. Constitution is absolute, it is infinite, it has no limitations and does not call for interpretation. We maintain everything in this world, physical, metaphysical, mental, oral, ethereal, has a cut-off point, except religion, which is based on faith.

No one cherishes more than we do, the four freedoms named in Article 1 of the Bill of Rights, those of religion, speech, press and assembly. We have lived by them, supported them, utilized them to the fullest, and will do our utmost to prevent them from being abused.

It has often been stated by our most learned jurists, that the right to free speech, is not a right to yell fire in a crowded theatre. Jay maintains the yelling itself, is not the breach, but the harmful result that should be penalized. In support of Jay's contention, Justice Hugo Black recently wrote an opinion in a libel suit in the U.S. Supreme Court stating: "It is time for this court to adopt the rule to the effect that the First Amendment was intended (Continued on Page 4)
