JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

UNITED NATIONS (WNS)--The Iraqi Mission has asked the U.S. to prevent "the new program of terror to be launched by the Jewish Defense League'' against Iraqi and Syrian officials in New York.

NEW YORK (WNS)--Eleven Soviet Jewish mothers from Lithiania have petitioned Soviet authorities to let their 14 children go to Israel even if they themselves are not permitted to do so.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Finance Pinhas Sapir reported that Israel faced the danger of commerical isolation because of the growing trend toward the regional-political organization of international trade.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Two Arabs were killed and six Israelis wounded in three separate incidents.

ELLENVILLE, N.Y. (WNS) -- Rehaveam Amir, the Israeli Consul General in New York City, denied that Israel has been 'intransigent and inflexible'' in her Middle East policy. Attend-ing the Brith Abraham convention, where he received the Organization's World Peace Award, Amir said ''we have already made major concessions.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Rabbi Arthur J. Lelyveld, president of the American Jewish Congress, has protested the statement of a U.S. official that Soviet Jewry did not constitute a national group and thus was not automatically entitled to Yiddish and Hebrew Voice of America broadcasts.

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- Fifteen persons, including 12 rabbis, 2 professors and the national coordinator of the Student Struggle for Soviet Jewry, were arrested and charged with criminal trespass after they had handcuffed themselves to the U.S. Mission to the UN to protest the State Department's alleged failure to take "meaningful action" to aid Soviet Jewry.

ALBANY, N.Y .-- The New York State Senate unanimously approved a bill banning discrimin-ation against Sabbath observing Jews in private employ. This bill, which was sponsored by Agudath Israel of America, had already passed the Assembly and Governor Rockefeller is expected to sign it into law.

WALTHAM, MASS.--Mrs. Albert Berler of San Antonio, Texas, was elected the 11th presi-dent of the Brandeis University National Women's Committee.

NEW YORK -- Beit Shemesh, some 15 miles NEW YORK--Beit Shemesh, some 15 miles southwest of Jerusalem, has been selected as the site of a three-year demonstration project to provide community social and medical ser-vices for the aged and handicapped of a develop-ment town, it was announced by Samuel L. Haber, Executive Vice-Chairman of the Joint Distribution Committee.
