In a letter addressed to Ivan Vasilievich Kuskevich, Chairman, Ispolkum, City Executive Committee, Kishinev, Philip E. Hoffman, President of the American Jewish Committee, pointed out that although there is worldwide protest against the trials outside the Soviet Union, "the impetus to put an end to these legal atrocities must come from within."

Mr. Hoffman asserted that "Jews are on trial in Kishinev for the 'crimes' of wanting to emigrate to Israel, or wanting to live in the Jewish tradition."

ROME (WNS) -- Pope Paul VI, in an address to the College of Cardinals, caused concern in Jewish circles when he stated, in remarks concerning Jerusalem, "it seems to us that it is in the interests of all that this city with its uniqueness, should be protected by a special statute and thus be better enabled to become a center of peace and no longer the object of implacable controversy and endless dispute. To that end we try to perform, with respect and friendship, a task of persuasion."

In New York, Philip Hoffman, president of

the American Jewish Committee, said "the most critical" aspect of the Pope's statement is its reference to the need for a 'special statute' for Jerusalem. If that implies the re-introduction of the proposal for the internationalization of Jerusalem, then we fear that this argument will confound the possibilities of advancing the cause of peace. To introduce an international agency in Jerusalem will invite the intrigue, political competition and controversy that every international city in the past has foundered on."

JEWISH PAPERS NEED HELP

BUENOS AIRES (WNS) --The two local Yiddish dailies, Di Yiddishe Zeitung and Di Presse have published appeals to the Jewish community of this city, especially businessmen and industrialists, to help them with ads because the economic situation of the papers is "desperate." The ads said "it would be a pity if Buenos Aires were converted spiritually into a cemetery." Argentine is in the throes of a prolonged economic crisis and the Jewish people are particularly hard hit.

Israeli Affairs to Date

The threats emanating from the Russo-Arab coalition in the Middle East during recent weeks, so far has been more propaganda than proper, but its times such as this when Commies are more apt to make that sudden move.

At the height of complacency by the allies the North Koreans overran the 39th parallel. They did it again in North Vietnam when the French thought they had the problem licked.

The big noise in the last two months was just that, a big nothing noise, with threats and taunts, but no backup. Plenty of bawl, but very little brawn. Lots of "Mike" without the might.

Here are recent events leading up to the very present.

Presidents Nikolai Podgorny of the Soviet Union and Anwar Sadat of Egypt, in Cairo on May 27, signed a treaty of military aid, friendship and cooperation between their respective countries. The 5,000 word treaty will be in force for a period of 15 years, after which it will be extended for another five years, unless either party indicates opposition.

CLAUSE NO. 7 OF THE TREATY SAYS: "If a situation should arise which, in the view of both parties, constitutes a threat to or a breach of the peace -- they will conduct immediate contacts in order to coordinate their positions for the purpose of eliminating the created threat and restoring the peace."

CLAUSE NO. 8 OF THE TREATY SAYS: "For the purpose of strengthening the defensive capabilities of Egypt, the two parties will continue to develop cooperation in the military sphere, on the basis of appropriate agreements between them. In particular, this cooperation includes aid in the training of members of the Egyptian armed forces and the absorption of equipment and weapons supplied to Egypt for strengthening her capability to turn aside the results of aggression, as well as strengthening her capability to stand against aggression in general."

Soviet President Nikolai Podgorny said in Cairo on May 27:

"American imperialism, after failing to achieve its goals by means of Israeli aggression, now tries new systems and various stratagems. American imperialism wears the phoney uniform of a broker of peace and, without being asked, she takes upon herself the role of mediator in the Israeli-Arab conflict.
