our power -- at present -- to liberate our lands, then let us at least work to preserve what remains to us. We must hold fast to our refusal, that we may gather strength for the battle -- a battle which cannot be avoided, no matter how some may try to evade or escape it."

The Israeli Minister of Finance, Commerce and Industry, Pinhas Sapir, said in Tel Aviv on May 31: "When the Egyptians say they wish to have peace, we know what they are thinking of today is a mere piece of paper, which will enable them to return their army and their Soviet advisers to the Sinai. When we speak about peace, we are talking about sending ping-pong players to play in Cairo or having an Egyptian football team visit Tel-Aviv. We think of peace in terms of free passage of tourists, businessmen and others to and from Israel, from all the neighboring countries."

Military Government sources in Judaea and Samaria said on June 9 that they expected about 3,000 university and high school students among the 70,000 summer visitors from the Arab countries. The students are expected to tour various parts of Israel during their stay.

An Arab contractor in East Jerusalem, who is the brother of former Jordanian Defence Minister Anwar Nusseibeh, has begun the first large-scale housing development for Arab residents in cooperation with the Jerusalem Municipality, it was announced on May 26.

A survey of the twenty Government labour-exchange offices which operate in Judaea and Samaria disclosed on June 9 that there is now a pronounced shortage of workers in the territories, the Israeli Ministry of Labour reported.

The Jordanian army newspaper "Al-Aksa" wrote on June 9 that the Fidayun had spent more than 50 million Pounds Sterling since the Six-Day War on "affairs that have nothing to do with the battle for liberation." The newspaper said that a large portion of the money had gone to "flawed" intelligence, salaries to "militiamen" and "secret groups" which had stockpiled weapons in the large cities "to try and seize the centers of power."

U.S. Assistant Secretary of Labour Jerome Rosow said on June 6, after a tour of the Golan Heights: "If I were an Israeli and lived in one of the kibbutzim lying at the foot of the Golan Heights, I would fight so that this territory would remain forever in the hands of Israel. As I saw it, this is not an ordinary piece of land and it was created by nature as a natural stronghold for attack and not for peace."
