OPERATES JEWISH COMMUNAL SERVICE CONFERENCE IN ISRAEL

Despite a difficult year of general, worldwide recession and with most of the IATA airlines reporting heavy losses (well over \$200 million) El Al completed fiscal 70/71 with a net profit of over 1 million Israeli pounds. This compares with 5 million Israeli

pounds profit in 69/70. Labor difficulties and heavy initial costs of absorbing the com-pany's first Boeing pany's first Boeing 747B, which necessitated the training of over 2,000 personnel, the expansion of Lod base facilities, erection of the 747 hangar, parking area and acquisition of ground support equipment, were responsible for the diminished profits.

This is the 12th consecutive year that El Al has registered a profit. Revenue for the 70/71 was IL 324,350, 000 as against IL 288,803,000 in 69/70 fiscal, an increase of 12.5%.

During El Al's last fiscal year (April 1970 to March 1971) El Al carried a total of 520, 770 passengers against 469,001 the previous 12 months, an increase of 11%. While on the trans-Atlantic route, passenger traffic increased by 10.3% from 173,529 to 192,475 during the same period. Passenger load factor for 70/71 was 67% - a new record for El Al and the highest achieved by any carrier.

Total freight carried by El Al in 70/71 was 20,949 tons as against 19,845 previous year an increase of 5.6%.

Freight revenue in 70/71 was IL 52,652,000 as against 46,273,000 in 69/70, an increase of 13.8%.



The Great Master has done it again. In his 25th book, Maurice Samuel has elec-

Entitled, "In Praise of Yiddish," the book can only be described as geshmak, delicious.

Leo Rosten popularized Yiddish. Mrs. Lillian Feinsilver supplied us with a key to mame lashon and a long compedium of idioms in her "The Taste of Yiddish,"

Now Maurice Samuel, the incomparable has crowned the language and his career with an exquisite treatment of the language.

Effectively, Mr. Samuel punctures the notion

that Yiddish is just a derivative of German.

True, many of the Yiddish words are from the German. But Yiddish developed its own locutions and idioms, so distinctive that a person who knows German could not understand much of Yiddish. Furthermore, Mr. Samuel, one of the world's best translators tells us, it is very difficult to transfer German into Yiddish.

Remember, Shakespeare borrowed most of his story-lines, but his plays are totally different from those on whom he depended because he infused them with his own genius,

So Yiddish is made up of terms from the German, and the Slavic, and the Hebrew, but the genius of Yiddish has transformed them. into something totally different.

If you want to kvell, if you want to be exhilarated, if you want to be mentally stimulated, if you want to know what a treasure mame lashon is, if you want to revel in the writings of one of the great masters of the English language, read "In Praise of Yiddish." It can't be overpraised.
