TELLING IT LIKE IT IS

Who Can We Turn To?

A peculiar odor lingers over our fine town. For our out-of-town readers who are unaware, in Las Vegas we have a Convention Authority. This is composed of an elite nine-man board, representing elected officials and key business leaders, who are chosen primarily to channel millions of dollars towards promoting tourism here.

This year in a closed authority election, an incumbent board member, Edward Doumani who represents motel interests, was ousted by a 3-2 vote. Later, Doumani produced three sworn affidavits that showed he should have regained his seat on the board. Through a recent court restraining order, Doumani's seat was reopened and a new wide open election will take place shortly.

Here is a classic case of an attempt by at least one individual to undermine the trust of the people represented. When election to one of the most important posts in our town is scarred by the blade of political chicanery, the people have no choice but to scream out in disdain. Public confidence in our Convention

The "Sunday Telegraph" of London reported on June 27 that the Soviet-Egyptian military aid and cooperation treaty signed in May, contains several unpublished clauses strengthening Soviet influence.

One of the clauses, the newspaper said, gives official status to the establishment of a joint Egyptian-Soviet "military coordination committee" responsible for battle plans, appointment of key officers to the Egyptian defence network, and training officers for the new arms and equipment currently being supplied by the USSR. The committee would

be equal in rank to the Egyptian general staff.

A second clause deals with full political cooperation between Egypt and the Soviet Union in all affairs connected with "filling the vacuum" which will exist in the Persian Gulf principalities after withdrawal of the British military presence there in 1972.

Third clause sets out changes in the structure of the Arab Socialist Union, Egypt's sole political party. The treaty provides for the creation of new party cadres along more "orthodox socialist" lines. Soviet Communist Party officials will be sent from Moscow

TEMPLE BREAKS GROUND FOR GYMNASIUM

TEMPLE BETH SHOLOM LEADERS WIELD SHOVELS FOR BUILDING TO BE COMPLETED

BY YEAR'S END. IT WILL BE CALLED RUBY KOLOD GYMNASIUM

Groundbreaking for a new gymnasium building took place at Temple Beth Sholom, 1600 E. Oakey Blvd., on Thursday, July 8th at 12:00 noon. The new building will be located in the rear section of the Temple grounds, and will provide a sorely needed facility for youth and adults alike. When completed it will mark the culmination of several years of efforts

and planning on the part of the Temple's Mens Club. The new multi-purpose structure will encompass 9,000 square feet and include a gymnasium floor of 60 x 100 feet for basketball and volleyball; two standard four-wall handball courts 20 x 40 x 20; a lobby, office space, boys and girls lockers and dressing rooms, toilets and shower rooms, storage area

and allotted space for sauna baths and steam rooms for future expansion. The building will tie into the existing Danny Kolod Memorial Youth House, and will thus provide a total of 11,000 square feet of well lighted, air-conditioned recreational facilities. Architect Ira Marshak designed the building and construction will be done by George Brookman and Com-

pany. Completion target date is the end of October 1971. Philanthropically involved in the project are Esther and Leonard Kolod, wife and son of the late Ruby Kolod, Las Vegas hotel executive for many years, who will be remembered for his many charitable endeavors. Preliminary plans call for the building to be dedicated as a perpetual memorial to his name.

2 KILLED, 9 INJURED BY ROCKETS

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Terrorists fired five Katyusha rockets at Petach Tikvah, a town of 80,000 nine miles west of Tel Aviv, kill-

ing two persons and injuring 19 others. Esther Vitas, 71, was killed when a rocket struck Beth Rivka Hospital for incurables.

Nine other patients were injured along with a physician, two nurses and a male nurse. Five-year-old Anat Darbashi was killed and her parents and two sisters injured when their home was struck by a rocket. Also struck was another private home and an empty schoolhouse. An unexploded rocket was found in the schoolyard.

Defense Minister Moshe Dayan and Army Chief of Staff General Haim Bar Lev arrived to survey the damage while ambulances were still taking the injured to hospitals.
