JERUSALEM (WNS)--Pres, Zalman Shazar cabled congratulations to Pres, M. Nixon on the successful completion of the Apollo-14 moon mission.

NEW YORK (WNS)--Rabbi Ervin Hoffman, director of the United Bikar Cholim, announced that patients in New York State institutions will now be supplied by the state with kosher meat and meat products if they desire.

LONDON (WNS)--The Weizman Institute of Science in Rehovoth, Israel will spend \$20 million for basic and applied research and the acquisition and improvement of equipment during the next fiscal year Maurice Boukstein, chairman of the Institute's executive council, announced here.

NEW YORK (WNS)--The B'nai B'rith Anti-Defamation League has warned that the "Committee For A Just Peace in the Middle East" is a Communist Front organization that is spreading anti-Israel propaganda in this country. ADL's general counsel, Arnold Forster, said the Committee was trying to raise funds for an anti-Israel advertising campaign without disclosing its true nature.

JERUSALEM (WNS)--Israel's Ambassador to Washington, Yitzhak Rabin, has been instructed to postpone his return to Jerusalem for consultations originally scheduled for this week.

TEL AVIV (WNS)--The Army, in an attempt to help solve the problem of chronic delinquency among Israeli youth, is opening its ranks to youths with criminal records, who have previously been ineligible for military service.

WASHINGTON (WNS)--Samuel DePalma, Assistant Secretary of State for International Organization Affairs, in a letter to Rabbi Arthur J. Lelyveld, president of the American Jewish Congress, said that the Department recognizes Soviet Jews as a national group but still would not institute broadcasts to them in Yiddish or Hebrew over the Voice of America "at this time."

TEL AVIV (WNS)--Six members of the terrorist gang that shelled Petach Tikvah July 7, killing three elderly women and a five-year-old girl were killed in a brief battle with an Israeli patrol as they tried to cross the Jordan River.

NEW YORK--America's largest Orthodox Jewish Youth movement has called upon all segments of the Jewish community to join together in forging a meaningful social revolution guided by the principles of the Torah ethic, as the only viable alternative to the counterculture.

NEW YORK--140 American and Canadian college graduates are expected to leave July 20th, for Israel to spend one year there as teachers, social workers and instructors. Another group of over 50 young Americans and Canadians will depart July 28th, to spend a year working on kibbutzim Shaar Hagolan and Magal. At least 150 more college and high school graduates will leave for Israel in September and October. Together with the first group which left for Israel in January the number of Sherut La'am participants in 1971 will total 400.

WASHINGTON (WNS)--The World Bank has granted Israel a \$30 million 20 year loan at 7-1/4 percent interest for road building purposes.

NEW YORK (WNS)--Rabbi Meir Kahane, national chairman of the Jewish Defense League, who will be sentenced on July 23 in Brooklyn Federal District Court after pleading guilty to having manufactured and exploded an explosive device in Camp Jedel, a JDL owned camp, told a press conference that violence was "the only way to persuade the Soviet Union to free its Jewish citizens."

WALTHAM, MASS. (WNS)--Brandeis University, which has not had a varsity football team since 1959, will compete in intercollegiate Club football this fall, Brandeis president Charles I. Schottland announced.
