I think the United States has to do whatever we can to make sure that this one free democratic state in the Middle East survives. And if I were President of the United States, I would take whatever steps were necessary to see that Israel survived."

In another economic area, Moshe Sandberg, who has been nominated by the Cabinet to succeed David Horowitz as Governor of the Bank of Israel, said in a radio interview that new taxes are "urgently needed" during the current fiscal year.

Bank of Israel reports showed the Treasury overdrawn by more than \$350 million by the end of the first quarter. The Government's debt to the Central Bank increased by \$98 million.

PARIS AND BONN SPLIT OVER ISRAEL

PARIS (WNS) -- As a split between Paris and Bonn over Middle East policy became public knowledge, President Georges Pompidou expressed hope that Franco-Libyan relations would continue to grow and pass from the field of military cooperation to that of normal economic ties.

France is selling jets to Libya while refusing to ship to Israel those Israel has already paid for.

French political circles are upset over the comments of West German Foreign Minister Walter Scheel, as reported by the Israeli

press. They consider his remarks in contradiction with the spirit and letter of the joint "working document" agreed on last May 14 by the six member nations of the EEC.

US FIRMS BUY ISRAELI GOODS

JERUSALEM (WNS)-- Newly released trade statistics show a continued increase in the sale of Israeli-made goods, mostly fashions, to American firms. In 1968, sales to America totaled \$2.85 million. In 1970, sales increased to \$6.40 million.

JERUSALEM (WNS)-- An announced visit by Black Panther leaders to the U.S. to seek the support of the American Jewish community to pressure the Israeli government to take quicker action on the poverty problems in that country, has caused a split in the party and the expulsion of one of its leaders.

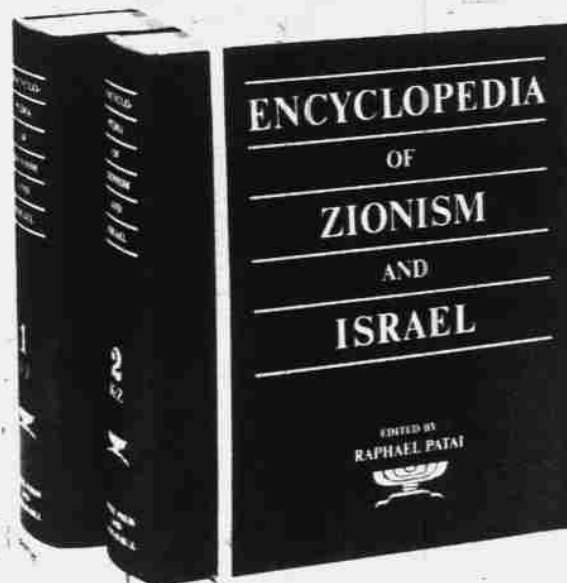
