ORTHODOX RABBIS ATTACK ZOA

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Two Orthodox Rabbis, Bernard A. Poupko, president of the Religious Zionists of America and Abraham Gross, president of the Rabbinical Alliance, in separate statements have at-

tacked Herman L. Weisman, president of the Zionist Organization of America, for urging Congress to drop proposed legislation that would authorize 30,000 emergency visas for Soviet Jews. Weisman said the visas would only "divert attention from their primary demand to be permitted to go to Israel."

Rabbi Gross called Weisman's statement "irresponsible" and "unrepresentative of Jewish opinion." Rabbi Poupko called on Orthodox and Zionist organizations to rectify "the harmful effects of the Weisman statement" by informing Congressmen of their affirmation of the proposed legislation. He said "it is regrettable, if not sinful that an obstacle is being placed in the path of Jews. We are no less concerned than the ZOA about the needs of our Soviet brethren to live full Jewish lives in Israel, but their safety and security, indeed their physical survival, takes precedence over this noble aspiration."

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- American correspondents James Yuenger of the Chicago Tribune and James Pieport of the Associated Press reported from Moscow that they had been harassed by Soviet police while talking to Soviet Jews. Yuenger said that on July 21, he and the man he was talking to were arrested and taken to police headquarters. Yuenger was released after 10 minutes. Pieport reported that on July 19, while talking to a Jew on Gorky Street, the police broke up the conversation and led the man away. Pieport was told the incident was none of his business.

That same week, two

American tourists were forced to leave the Soviet Union before the end of their 22-day-tour after being accused of "anti-Soviet" activities. Irving Silverman, 51, of Roslyn, N. Y., publisher of "The Knitting Times" and Leonard Shuster, 35, a businessman from Winnwood, Pa., were charged with "heavy involvement with Soviet citizens and the distribution of anti-Soviet literature." They denied the charges. Silverman said, "we admit speaking with Soviet citizens, Jews and non-Jews alike. But it was mainly at the insistence of those people themselves who wanted to know more about the U.S."

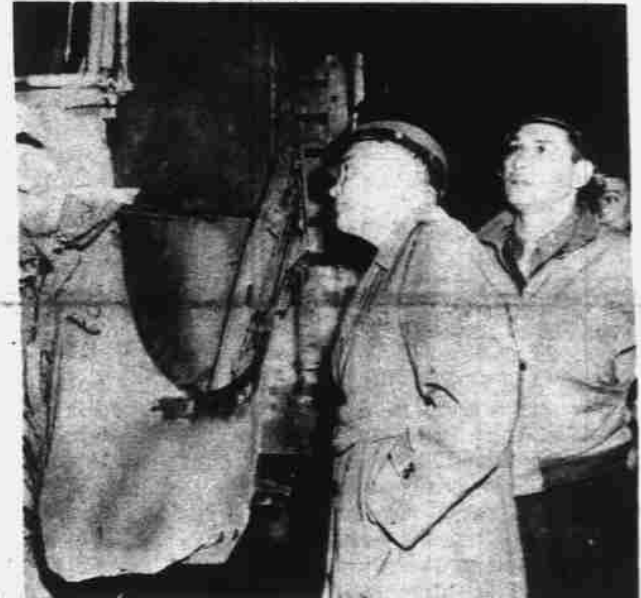

GREENSPUN BEHIND GEN. EISENHOWER

"PRESIDENT EISENHOWER RECENTLY ASKED, 'WHAT HAS HAPPENED TO OUR CONCEPT OF BEAUTY AND DECENCY AND MORALITY?'"

The above photo was apparently taken during World War 2, and the excerpt, following the photo, was used extensively during Greenspun's unsuccessful campaign for the nomination for governor in 1962.

The framed photo was prominently hung in Greenspun's private office to impress visitors of the proximity Hank had to Ike. It was there at least until fire destroyed the old Sun building in 1963. The photo was reprinted, prominently on the cover, to promote the sale of Greenspun's book in 1966.

The dates are important. They prove that long after he wrote a blistering attack (and rightly so) against Eisenhower in 1956, Greenspun continued to use Ike's name and photo wherever and whenever it would be advantageous to him (Hank).

Like we have been calling to the attention of our readers for the past many moons, Greenspun is a greedy, selfish, vindictive man, who will not be deterred in his quest for self gain. Nothing, neither truth nor conscience, will stand in his way of personal profit.
