

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

TEL AVIV (WNS)--A Jewish woman from Vilna arrived here with her 18-month-old son who is suffering from a blood ailment which Soviet doctors have said is incurable. Mrs. Bella Tzerulmikov left the Soviet Union on a six-month visa after she persuaded Soviet authorities that a cure might be found in Israel.

WASHINGTON (WNS)--Rep. John Buchanan, a former Birmingham, Ala., pastor says he is "not very impressed" with the official arguments recently presented to Congress against Yiddish Voice of America Broadcasts.

JERUSALEM (WNS)--Police arrested eight persons Saturday night, July 17, after a day of stone-throwing and demonstrations by religious zealots and a series of scuffles between them and non-religious youths.

TEL AVIV (WNS)--Labor troubles continued to plague Israel as postal service and sick-fund clinic workers began job actions protesting delays in meeting their wage and fringe benefit demands.

JERUSALEM (WNS)--Minister of Tourism Moshe Kol warned that Israel might price itself out of the international tourist market because the Government has failed so far to implement its decision to give the tourist industry the same assistance it provides other export industries.

TEL AVIV (WNS)--Israeli anti-aircraft guns fired on two Egyptian Sukhoy 7 fighter-bombers which flew over Israeli positions on the central and southern sections of the Suez Canal line.

LONDON (WNS)--The 35 Jewish sit-ins from the Georgian Republic who were arrested may have been forcibly returned to Georgia, according to a report from a Jewish scientist in Moscow, Vladimir Slepak.

TEL AVIV (WNS)--President Nixon's popularity has risen in Israel, according to the latest poll Public Opinion of Israel which reports 54 per cent of Israelis are satisfied with Nixon's treatment of Israel, compared to 49 per cent last March. Another 27 per cent are "more or less" pleased with Nixon's attitude toward Israel. Ten percent are dissatisfied and nine per cent had no opinion.

NEW YORK (WNS)--New Jersey Philanthropist H. Jerome Sisselman has pledged one million dollars to Bar-Ilan University in Ramat-Gan, Israel, for the establishment of a Religious and Cultural Center. The center, which will serve the university community and the surrounding area of Ramat-Gan, will be one of the first of its kind in the country.

NEW YORK--Six Soviet Jews who had their appeals for mitigation of jail sentences rejected by the Supreme Court of the Russian Republic were among a group of Leningrad Jews who attempted to present a petition to United Nations Secretary General U Thant last year, were arrested shortly thereafter.

NEW YORK--Yitzhak Rabin, Israel's Ambassador to the United States, and Ehud Avriel, chairman of the Zionist Actions Committee of the World Zionist Organization, have accepted invitations to address the 74th National Convention of the Zionist Organization of America this September in Pittsburgh.

NEW YORK (LNS)--Some 100 senior rabbinical students left New York this week to begin their mission of spreading Torah Judaism to hundreds of communities across the United States, Canada and Mexico, as part of the Lubavitcher summer 'peace corps' program. This year, the 23rd consecutive summer of the program, the students will visit locations in Colombia, Venezuela and Equador as well.

SAO PAULO (WNS)--Brazil has banned the publication, circulation, distribution and sale of Hitler's "Mein Kampf" and ordered all copies of the book seized.

WALTHAM, MASS.--A former chief of the "Voice of America" German Service Dr. Mauritius B. Kahn, has willed his entire private library, which includes many out-of-print German volumes, to Brandeis University's Goldfarb Library.

SURPRISE LAKE CAMP, N.Y.-- Surprise Lake Camp, one of the oldest and largest Jewish community owned camps in the United States, now has twenty-one Israelis among their staff of almost two hundred counselors. They are the largest single group of the two hundred youthful Israelis brought to this country by the Youth and Hechalutz Department of the World Zionist Organization and the American Zionist Youth Foundation to bring a touch of Israeli life to the thousands of American youngsters who spend their vacations in summer camps throughout the United States.

NEW YORK--Max Stern, President of Hartz Mountain Products Corporation and International Chairman of the Board of Shaare Zedek Hospital in Jerusalem, Israel's revered House of Healing, proudly announced the beginning of construction of the new Shaare Zedek Medical Center.

LOS ANGELES-- The first international gathering of professionals and businessmen in the chemical field, ever held in Israel, will take place this coming October, within the framework of the Israel Chemistry Week.

NEW YORK--Mixed marriages, by which 70 per cent of the offspring are lost to the Jewish community, can undermine Jewish continuity, Rabbi Marc H. Tanenbaum, national director of the Interreligious Affairs Department of the American Jewish Committee, said.

LONDON (WNS)--An analysis of the latest Soviet census by the Institute of Jewish affairs here discloses that the Russian Jewish population has declined by 5.2 percent to 2.1 million in the last 11 years. During the same period, the total population of the Soviet Union rose nearly 33 million to 241,720,000, an increase of 15.8 per cent.

LONDON (WNS)--At least 5000 of Leningrad's 300,000 Jews are ready to emigrate to Israel if they can get visas, it was learned from members of the Cinovya Israeli--"The Songs of Israel Underground Organization."

BROOKLYN (WNS)--The Brooklyn Jewish Community Council has urged Americans not to buy Toyota cars or travel by Japan Air Lines because both companies are cooperating in the Arab boycott of Israel.

PARIS (WNS)--Anti-Semitic literature, bearing a swastika and signed by the "Friends of Adolf Hitler" were distributed on the Champs Elysees. The leaflets called on "all Frenchmen to be careful of the kikes and to wait for the day when they will be eradicated."
