### Peculiar Press

If we haven't convinced you up to now that there is something peculiar in the press coverage in Las Vegas, set your eye on cold statistics of the space given the Howard Hughes portion of the Governor's press conference by the Las Vegas Sun as compared to the Las Vegas Review Journal.

Chris Chrystal's story on HH stretched over five columns of page one in the Sun, occupying 27 column inches, with a jump on page four consuming an additional 8-3/4 inches for a total of almost three feet of column space. Jim Brook's story in the R.J. was 3/4 of an inch.

Chris wrote 420 words, which called for six headlines and 60 lines of type, while Jim wrote 23 words in five lines.

Mind you, these were not features. They were straight news coverage, reporting on the governor's press conference. The R-J listed 10 items, the Sun eight. Isn't there something wrong? Aren't the readers of one or both papers being cheated, by either too much or too little? Surely there is a happier medium than the facts and figures we state. The spread against the public is bigger than any odds ever

### ISRAEL HIKES FUEL OIL PRICES

TEL AVIV (WNS)--A contemplate further tax on most types of fuel oil that went into effect this week sent prices soaring from ten to 140 percent on gasoline and domestic cooking gas.

But Government officials insisted it was not a tax. They said the price hike was merely intended to bring prices in Israel into line with world market prices that have risen in the past year.

It was disclosed however that the price rise on fuel was decided by the Cabinet's economic committee and approved by the Knesset finance committee but was withheld from the public until the Finance Minister determined that the time was ripe to announce it.

Finance Minister Pinhas Sapir said that the Government did not contemplate further taxes this year and denied that this implied that new taxes were under consideration for next year. Moshe Neudorfer, director of internal revenue, told reporters the same thing. "We have no plans to raise any taxes before the end of the current fiscal year, contrary to all the rumors and stories in the newspapers," he said.

The new fuel "tax" has already sparked demands for higher fares in taxis and other forms of transportation. Gasoline prices have soared by ten percent and the price of kerosene nearly tripled today.

The public is waiting to see if the Israel Electric Corp., the largest single consumer of fuel, would raise its rates.

WASHINGTON--The interests of Christians, Jews and Muslims in the city of Jerusalem will be served best if the city remains united and under Israeli jurisdiction, a noted American rabbi declared.

Rabbi Marc H. Tanenbaum, National Director of Interreligious Affairs of the American Jewish Committee, testifying before the Near East Subcommittee of the House Committee on Foreign Affairs, based his statement on two major premises:

..From a religious and historical point of view, the Jewish concept of Jerusalem as "the holy city" of Judaism dates from the time of the Patriarch Abraham, from whom the Jewish people trace their beginnings nearly four thousand years ago;

..From a contemporary and political viewpoint, "there has never been such free access to the holy places as since 1967 when Jerusalem was reunified under Israeli jurisdiction."

Rabbi Tanenbaum was one of three witnesses

JERUSALEM (WNS)-- Additional Phantom's Israel's request for more Phantom jets is expected to be the number one topic of discussion during Assistant Secretary of State Joseph J. Sisco's 7-10 day visit here. Also to be discussed is the extent of U. S. commitment to Israel in face of growing Soviet involvement in the Middle East and U.S. plans for an interim agreement for reopening the Suez Canal.

are a necessity for Israel in view of the growing obsolescence of its Air Force planes which are largely composed of pre-1967 French Mirages. Both the U.S. and Israel oppose the idea of Egyptian troops crossing the Canal to occupy any areas evacuated by an Israeli pullback, but the U.S. is reported willing to accept a "token movement" of Egyptian troops across the Canal.
