

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

TEL AVIV (WNS)--Five terrorists, members of the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine, all of them on the "wanted" list, were killed in Gaza after an all night pursuit and gun battle with an Israeli patrol.

MONTREAL (WNS)--Edgar Bronfman, vice president for American operations of Seagrams, Ltd. has succeeded his late father, Samuel Bronfman, as president of the giant distillery, Seagrams, Ltd.

WASHINGTON (WNS)--Sources here say that President Nixon will make the final decision on whether or not the Voice of America will institute Yiddish and Hebrew broadcasts to the Jews in the Soviet Union.

JERUSALEM (WNS)--Labor Minister Joseph Almog, speaking over the Army radio, said the 40,000 Arab workers from the occupied territories now employed in Israel represented the "optimum number" that can be absorbed by Israel's labor market and should not be increased.

TEL AVIV (WNS)--Thirty thousand prospective tourists, mainly from North American and Western Europe, have cancelled their flight reservations El Al, Israel's airline, reported. The cancellations were due to the acute shortage in hotel rooms in Israel.

TEL AVIV (WNS)--The first factory to ever be established in a Druze village employing 250 to produce hostery, was opened by the Bibor Textile Enterprise at Daliyat el Carmel on the crest of Mt. Carmel.

JERUSALEM (WNS)--Yehuda Allan, head of the Civic Information Center, reported that a record 15,000 overseas students have volunteered to work at Kibbutzim during July and August and another 17,000 students are expected by the end of the year.

TEL AVIV (WNS)--The Tel Aviv district court has ordered Meir Lansky, reputed American gambling boss, to deposit \$17,500 to cover costs in case he loses his libel suit against the newspaper Yediot Achronot. The paper had asked that Lansky deposit the money because he is not a citizen of Israel and his tourist visa may expire.

TEL AVIV (WNS)--A terrorist who threw a hand grenade at Defense Minister Moshe Dayan's car when it passed through Gaza on April 3, 1969, went on trial before a military tribunal. The grenade missed Dayan's vehicle but killed two Arab bystanders and wounded eight others. The defendant is a member of the Popular Liberation Front.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Absorption Minister Nathan Peled, speaking at a new immigrants' township at Karmiel in Upper Galilee, said that if the need arose, Israel could absorb one-half million immigrants within the next five years.

LAS VEGAS ISRAELITE

TEL AVIV (WNS)--Five terrorists, members of a gang responsible for the 1969-1970 bombings in Tel Aviv, Haifa and Natanya, were arrested by police and confessed. The leader was a 26-year-old Arab from Nazareth, Abdul Malek, a lawyer who has defended terrorists brought to trial. Three members of the gang were Israeli Arabs and the fourth was a resident of Nablus in the West Bank. Police said the men confessed setting off bombs in a parked car on Karen Kayameth Blvd. near Dizengoff St. in Tel Aviv in 1969, in a parking lot near a Haifa movie house that same year, and in two cars in residential areas of Natanya in 1970. A cache of explosives, bazookas, bazooka shells, light machine guns and demolition equipment was found in a Nablus schoolhouse where one of the terrorists taught.

TEL AVIV (WNS)--Four immigrant families from the Georgian Soviet Republic staged a sit-in at Lydda Airport protesting the accommodations offered them by the Absorption Ministry. Three of the families demanded housing in Lod where they said they had family and friends. The fourth family refused accommodations in Kiryat Atta, though they have relatives in that town.

NEW YORK--Samuel J. Silberman, a New York Jewish communal leader, has been elected Chairman of the Board of the Florence G. Heller-JWB Research Center, Morton L. Mandel, Cleveland industrialist and president of the National Jewish Welfare Board, announced at a JWB Board of Directors meeting.

EIN KAREM, Jerusalem--Professor Aaron J. Beller, Head of the Department of Neurosurgery and Division of Pediatric Surgery, at the Hadassah-Hebrew University Medical Center, and Professor of Neurosurgery at the Hebrew University Medical School, has been elected Dean of the Faculty of Medicine of the Hebrew University for a three-year term. He succeeds Professor Jonathan Magnes who was elected Dean in November, 1968.
