We are in the process of preparing a huge Exhibit which will consist of approximately 300 enlarged photos and a number of books, pertaining to the Holocaust period.

We will appreciate very much having your advice, whether it would be proper to have such an exhibit displayed in Las Vegas. We are taking into consideration, on one hand, the special character of Las Vegas as a city of fun, on the other hand, the undisputed fact that it is a place attracting many people from all parts of the nation and the world.

We are interested in having the displayed in a location accessible to the whole, primarily non-Jewish, population for reasons which - I believe - don't require elaboration.

If your answer is affirmative, would you please let us know whom to contact for practical arrangements and whether we may count on your cooperation and moral support.

We firmly believe the display of such an exhibit will strengthen indirectly our efforts on behalf of our brethren in Russia.


