Paul's Sour Grapes

Local newspaper columnist Paul Price was denied in his quest for a seat on the city commission about two months ago when he lost an election to television personality Hal Morelli by 2,000 votes. A series of hard-hitting articles by our brother Jay Tell, who publishes the Las Vegas Free Press, was one factor in that election. Now the columnist is as mad as an infant a half hour before feeding time.

Because he was halted before he could use his vindictive tactics as a newspaper columnist in an office as powerful as city commissioner, Price now decides to file a \$750 thousand libel lawsuit against brother Jay, Hal Morelli and Morelli's campaign manager, Bill Willard. Price alleges that Morelli, Willard and others "acted in concert" with publisher Jay Tell to distribute 20,000 copies of reprints from the newspaper just before the election "so he would have no recourse in law to protect himself."
