DATELINE: 37,000 FEET ABOVE LAS VEGAS: FRANK SINATRA JR started his first of three shows just about the time the American Airline 727 was passing over his usual Vegas showroom, the Frontier Circle F Theater. Frank inaugurated "live" entertainment on the LA to NY flight last week, and from all indications, the novel concept could become a regular attraction. The 350-plus passengers were extremely orderly as they lined up in the 747 aisles to move to the newly installed lounge area in the plane's tailend. The passengers politely took turns at the shows so that nearly everyone who wanted to sit in on the shows could and did. Frank wrote a new song especially for the occasion, "Night Sky" and spent his time between shows being swamped by autograph seekers and photo bugs. The unique talent outlet was the joint brainstorm of American Airlines vp JERRY JACOB and Frank's manager TINO BARZIE, LARRY O'BRIEN conducted Sinatra's seven man

band in the comparatively tight quarters. The three shows plus the impromptu jam session in the wee hours of the morning proved a big hit with the passengers and could open a whole new avenue of sky cabarets. Frank who was flying to NY for business and a guesting with JOEY BISHOP on the Tonight Show, heads next for Hawaii in late September, then October in Australia. He'll return to the Frontier in December...
