



"Double Dynamite" is the name of the entertainment game at Caesars Palace with British songbird Petula Clark and the fiery new sound of Sergio Mendes and Brasil '77 in a three-week engagement in the Las Vegas Strip hotel's Circus Maximus theatre-restaurant.

Also featured on the twice-nightly bill (8 p.m. & midnight) is the distinctive satire of off-beat comedian Guy Marks, who deals in "zingers and the truth.'

A petite blond with eyes of blue, Petula Clark has "a way about her" -- and the voice to go with it -- that appeals to all age groups.
