JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

NEW YORK (WNS)--American Zionist Federation President Rabbi Israel Millet, in his annual Rosh Hashanah message, called upon American Jews to "help make available to Israel the means to bridge the cultural and social gaps which are inevitable in the building of a society in which the population has more than quadrupled in a little more than two decades."

NEW YORK (WNS)--Chairman of the World Zionist Organization's American Section, Dr. Emanuel Neumann, in his annual Rosh Hashanah message noted "the dangers that lie behind the faltering cease fire agreement." He added that sacrifices are being urged on Israel, even by its friends, who unwittingly preach the acceptance of peace terms that can only lead to new and even more terrifying outbreaks of hostility."

TEL AVIV (WNS)--An egged bus going from Beersheba to Tel Aviv collided head on with a bus carrying high school children from Tel Aviv to Gaza near Kibbutz Saad killing II and injuring 46.

NEW YORK--Operation Israel -- the unique group of fact-finding tours sponsored by the United Jewish Appeal -- will start its 1972 season with the departure of a Physicians and Wives flight on October 31. There will be a total of eleven missions, each one taking a cross-section of leaders from American Jewish communities across the United States to Israel to study first-hand the fabric of Israeli life today.

STARLIGHT, Penn.--Michael Dockterman, Rock Island, Illinois, has been elected International President of Aleph Zadik Aleph, the boys' component of the B'nai B'rith Youth Organization; and Marcy Rosenbaum of East Meadow, New York, has been elected International President of B'nai B'rith Girls, at the International conventions of the two organizations held here at Camp B'nai B'rith.

PARIS (WNS)--Dr. Jacob Kaplan, Chief Rabbi of France, was awarded the City of Paris medal for "distinguished services to Paris, its civilization and culture."

PITTSBURGH (WNS)--Addressing a major Jewish organization for the first time, Rabbi Meir Kahane, head of the Jewish Defense League, told delegates to the annual Zionist Organization of America convention that the future of the American Jews is "bleak."

NEW YORK (WNS)---The body of Rabbi Mordche Shlomo Friedman, 80, was flown to Jerusalem for burial on the Mount of Olives after funeral services here.
