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Hotel's Congo Room. I heard he was coming a few weeks ago and didn't say anything to my wife. News travels quickly in this town and before I could say dinner for two, she had plans to go see her Mathis. What could a husband do? I called up my mother for advice. She said I'll make the reservations. Go and have a good time. We went and we did.

His opening songs included, "The Morning Of My Life" and two Carpenter tunes, "Close To You" and "We've Only Just Begun." As usual, he mixes standard tunes with contemporary very well and went on to deliver "April In Paris" and everyone's current hit, "You Got A Friend," In typical Mathis style, he delivers the song in most cases better than the original artist which puts him in a class all by himself. Songs that followed included "Day In And Day and "It's Too Late."

As he began his medley (and what a medley this man has), tingles of nostalgia pass through the mind. We danced to many of his oldies when we were just courting over ten years ago.
His biggies were: "Twelfth Of Never," "Wild
Is The Wind," "Sonny," "It's Not For Me
To Say," and some wonderful show tunes that
he is best known for, "Tonight, Tonight," "To
Dream The Impossible Dream," "Wonderful
Worderful" and of course "Worderful" Wonderful" and, of course, "Maria,"

Mathis is certainly a guy who made it with his own style. He doesn't belt out tunes like some stars, but makes love to them. His fluttery, high-pitched voice has made fans out of millions. His albums are the most consistent sellers in the easy-to-listen-to class of all performers.

As I looked around the packed Congo Room, it was obvious to see that there were many other husbands in my predicament. They just have to play second fiddle to Mathis ....

We can't forget to elaborate on the funny man in the show, Nipsy Russell. Nipsy is too much. We first saw him about 12 years ago when he played a small but very popular club in Harlem called The Baby Grand.

Some of his lines that stand out in my memory at his current gig at the Sahara are, "They tell us we don't live in the ghetto anymore, now they call it Central City.

Nipsy broke up the audience when he told us that he doesn't protest Howard Hughes "He might buy me and send me anymore. back to Africa and I won't trade my Caddy in for an elephant."

When you think Nipsy has run out of material, he goes into his nightly dance lessons, teaching us the latest hip steps. I call him the black Arthur Murray of today. Nipsy shows you the Pony, Boogalo, Funky Walk and Funky Chicken. He tells you how the step began and then makes each one look as easy as your morning shower. The time he spends on stage is important, He delivers the usual racial messages but in a way that you want to kiss him. He is a very funny and most intelligent man.
