#### Grand Opening

Not since the days of the club 88 in New York's Greenwich Village have we seen a better female impressionist than Mr. Lynne Carter. After a 12 year absence from the Vegas scene, Carter opened the brand new Royal Las Vegas hotel last Sunday in a fun-filled debut with a belly laugh-a-minute enjoyed by all first nighters in attendance.

Customers at the Cozy Couch Room were greeted with extremely good imitations by this very hard working performer.

The first of five costume changes saw Carter wrapped in a rainbow of feathers doing a Phyllis Diller so exacting that Phyllis herself would certainly feel she was seeing her shadow on stage. Carter's hilarious jokes included one about his 13 year old Bar Mitzvah where he came to the reception in a dress. When it came time - he said "Today I am a Man?"

His subsequent imitations included Marlene Dietrich, Bette Davis and Mae West (as the Statue of Liberty) as Mae West, holding the torch and complaining that she needs a man, Carter said "I'll even settle for the Jolly Green Giant."

Carter's closing number was that of Pearl Bailey - who, as Carter explains, gave him his first break in show business.

UNITED NATIONS (WNS)-- Israel's Foreign Minister Abba Eban addressed the United Nations General Assembly and offered a five-point peace program for the Middle East including direct talks between himself and Egyptian Foreign Minister Mahmoud Riad. The other four points included work towards a Suez Canal agreement, a resumption of the (Gunnar V.) Jarring mission, a settlement of the refugee problem and a determination of the "principles of peace."

Eban said the meeting with Riad could be held now during the General Assembly meeting to discuss either an interim settlement under either U.S. auspices or a permanent peace based on Security Council Resolution 242 directed by Ambassador Jarring, the UN's Middle East mediator.

Eban urged, "Let us break out of devious procedures and sterile polemics into a new vision and a new hope" and added, the cause of peace will not be fulfilled by living out the (Continued on Page 3)

### LIBYA SETS TO BREACH CONTRACT

PARIS (WNS) -- French aeronautical technicians who had been working on Mirages delivered to Libya, and others who had been preparing ground installations for the bulk of the Mirages due to be delivered later this year have been requested to leave Libya it was learned here.

French sources said the ouster was necessary to give Libya, an absolutely "free hand" in how and where to use

the planes. By terms of the sale contract between France and Libya, the Mirages are not to be used against Israel.

It was expected here the Mirages would first be used to support the rebels in Chad, a black Central African republic, whose government is supported by France.
