PARIS (WNS) ---French aeronautical technicians who had been working on Mirages delivered to Libya, and others who been preparing ground installations for the bulk of the Mirages due to be delivered later this year have been requested to leave Libya it was learned here.

French sources said the ouster was necessary to give Libya, an absolutely "free hand" in how and where to use

the planes.

By terms of the sale contract between France and Libya, the Mirages are not to be used against Israel.

It was expected here the Mirages would first be used to support the rebels in Chad, black Central African republic, whose government is supported by France.
