### PROBLEM OF JEWISH YOUTH

Dr. William A. Wexler, International President of the B'nai B'rith, said at the triennual convening of that organization: "Bright, articuiate. Jewishly-committed young men and women are resisting a Jewish community they regard as overwhelmed with form and structure and barren of substance."

He finds a part of the solution to this problem a new coalition he calls "nonpartisan, liberal," ethnic-racial-religious-labor. This, of course, includes about everything in American life. A vital part of this new grouping would be a closing of the gap between the Jews and the blacks which developed when the black revolution turned "inward and separatist" and caused "harshness and penalty to Jews." By the latter Dr. Wexler means attacks on Jewish merchants and ousting of Jewish teachers.

Is this the motivation for a sincere alliance? Or should it be one based first on mutual understanding of the needs and aspirations of both It is a moot matter whether young Jews would join a coalition to salvage the cause of Jewish merchants and teachers. By his every statement it would seem that Dr. Wexler reinforces his own claim that "many Jewish youths are not alienated. They are accessible to us. The crucial problem is: Are we accessible to them?" And the answer is no. To paraphrase Dr. Wexler, in this kind of cause young Jews will find not less but more preaching from Jewish pulpits, more not less glibness from Jewish Presidents, more not less catering at bar mitzvahs and less not more genuine Jewish involvement in the struggle for peace and for racial and social equality.




